



About the Judges . . .

GLENN CLIFFE BAINUM

Director of Music, Southern Illinois Normal University 1914 to 1922. Assistant Director of University of Illinois Band Department 1922-1923. Director of Public School Music, Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1924 and 1925. Director, Northwestern University Band and Professor of Music, Northwestern University School of Music, Evanston-Chicago, Illinois, since 1926.

President, American Bandmaster's Association. (Served as Secretary-Treasurer from 1933 to 1947.)

Graduate of University of Ilinois, with degrees A. B. and B. Music

Professional concert band of 75, Grant Park (Chicago) summer concerts.

Veteran of World Wars I and II. In past war three and one-half years service, with over two years duty overseas as Chief of Music Branch, Hq. Special Services, European Theater of Operations.

Formerly has served as associate conductor, Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra; Associate Conductor, North Shore Festival Chorus; Director, N. U. Men's and Womens choral organizations, and Summer Session Symphony Orchestra.

HENRY FILLMORE

Henry Fillmore is a band name that is internationally known. He is probably the most prolific writer of band marches since John Philip Sousa. He has been director of the official band of Station WLW and has toured the whole North American continent with the Fillmore Band. His latest ascent to band fame is his recent election at Madison, Wisconsin, to the presidency of the American Bandmaster's Association. He is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers. Henry Fillmore is also President of the Fillmore Music House, Publishers, Cincinnati, Ohio, and has judged many school band festivals.

L. BRUCE JONES

L. Bruce Jones was Director of Bands and Orchestras for seventeen years at the Little Rock Senior High School, Little Rock, Arkansas. He was also Supervisor of Instrumental Music of the Little Rock Public Schools.

The Little Rock High School Band has won the enviable reputation of being among the best of the nation's top-notch high school bands. Its record is one of steady growth and accomplishment; starting with fourteen members in 1928, the band department has grown to include two bands with a combined membership of 165 players.

Mr. Jones earned a B. S. in Education at the Northeast Missouri State Teachers College, where he directed the Training School Band and was Concertmaster and Assistant Conductor of the College Symphony. He received the degree B. Mus. cum laude from the University of Illinois where he was Concertmaster of the University Symphony, played principal BB-flat bass in the Concert Band, and directed the Second Regimental Band. He was awarded the gold medal for outstanding service in the Concert Band.

Mr. Jones has served widely as adjudicator of state and national contests; and as guest conductor of state and national clinics and of university summer school music groups. He has been a member of the faculty at George Peabody College for Teachers, Nashville, Tennessee, for four summers, and holds a Master's Degree from that institution.

DR. WILLIAM D. REVELLI

The musical training of Dr. William D. Revelli has been both varied and extensive. He has studied under such outstanding men of music as Felix Borowski, Leon Sametini, George Dasch, H. A. Vandercook, Louis Victor Saar and Charles Spadoni. In 1915, he entered the Beethoven Music Conservatory in St. Louis, Missouri. He continued his education at the Columbia Music School, the Chicago Musical College and the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago, and in 1925 was appointed music supervisor in the public schools of Hobart, Indiana. In the course of his studies at the Columbia School of Music, he had become interested in the school band field and soon after his Hobart appointment he organized the instrumental music department in that city.

In the meantime, he continued his studies at the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago, and during the five years which preceded his coming to Michigan he conducted the Hobart High School Band to five consecutive national championships.

Thus, in the fall of 1935 Dr. Revelli assumed the duties of conductor of the University of Michigan Bands and Head of the Department of Wind Instruments. Today he is recognized as one of the truly outstanding figures in the concert band world and makes many appearances each year in all parts of the country in the capacity of guest conductor and judge of band festivals.

The University of Michigan Concert Band has been acclaimed by such eminent musicians and conductors as Dr. Edwin Franko Goldman, Dr. Frank Simon, Dr. Chas. O'Neil, Dr. Roy Harris, Dr. Rudolph Ganz, Morton Gould, Ferde Grofe, Henry Cowell, and others, as being without a peer among university bands.

The University of Michigan Marching Band has thrice been named as the "All-American Band" by the press and radio. Bill Stern, Ted Husing, Harry Wismer and other outstanding radio announcers have lauded the Michigan Marching Band as one of the nation's foremost marching and playing bands.

Richard Franko Goldman, in his recent book, "The Concert Band," pays tribute to Michigans concert band and cites it as a model of university bands.

Dr. Revelli is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, honorary college band fraternity, Alpha K. Lamda, Phi Mu Alpha, and a host of other musical societies. He is editor of the "World of Music," band and orchestra method, published in 1937, and serves as an editor of the "Etude Music Magazine," and the "University of Michigan Band Series." He is also past President of the National University and College Band Conductors' Association.

In June, 1947, the Chicago Musical College conferred the degree of Doctor of Music upon Professor Revelli.

He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association. Taught summer school courses in Northwestern in school band arranging. Has a textbook devoted exclusively to arranging for School Bands. Served in an army band during World War II. At present is the editor for the Neil A. Kjos Music Co., Chicago, Ill.

The Basis of School Band Competition

"The primary purpose of the school music competition is to serve as a factor in the educational program through the direct values, the inspiration, examples and incentives afforded the young people and their teachers and directors. Therefore, adjudication of participants should be regarded as a means for evaluating the progress and musical status of the group or the individual, rather than a mere comparison with other participants to secure an expert opinion of which is best, which is second best, and so on.

"This has been made possible by abandoning the 'ranking' or 'place' method of adjudication in favor of the now widely used rating plan, adopted by the National School Band Association some years ago."

Bands participating in the Florida State Contest are classified according to the total enrollment of the school represented and the age of the band. Adjudication against a standard, as determined by competent judges, in each class, determines the accomplishment of the organization or the individual.

Depending upon the rating received in each division of competition, bands are placed in one of three divisions, 1st. 2nd or 3rd. In addition, the judges, on each of their adjudication sheets for each band or individual competing, will make constructive criticism and helpful suggestions for improvement.

Bands placing in first division, in each class, in the State Contest are eligible for competition in the regional contests of the National School Band Association.







Bay County High School Band (Panama City)

ORIN WHITLEY, Director

The Bay County High School Band was organized in 1937 by its present director, Orin Whitley. Originally consisting of ten members, the band expanded rapidly until in 1938 a 45-piece band participated in its first Music Festival. Since then the band has entered Class "A" and has participated in eleven festivals. The band is very active in civic function and has attended three gubernatorial inaugurations. A number of the band members have been awarded scholarships by outstanding colleges and several have become professional musicians.

In September of 1947, the band moved into its new music building, which has all modern facilities for complete courses.

Chattahoochee High School Band

MRS. B. LAMAR WATSON, Director

The Chattahoochee High School Band was organized in 1943 by the County Supervisor of Bands, Mr. H. Carlton Mason. The following year it was directed by Miss LeJune Hughes. M. C. Thompson directed the band the next three years. This year after a serious setback, Mrs. Mary McDonald Watson came to Chattahoochee in October. Since then the band has been working with renewed interest, and although there are only 66 students in senior high school, the band is composed of 50 very active members. This year the band made all "first division" for the first time in its history, in the district festival in Pensacola.

Mary McDonald Watson received her degree of A.B. in Elementary Education but soon switched over to her hobby field of music and entered the first orchestra ever to enter a band contest in Florida in the district festival in Tallahassee in 1944. Since then she has had "first division" bands each year—from Mt. Pleasant, Florida, and later in Auburn, Alabama. This year she started as assistant to County Supervisor H. C. Mason, but due to serious situation in Chattahoochee Band, took it over in late October. 1

Clearwater High School Band STEPHEN W. YANETOVICH, Director

The Clearwater High School Band, under the direction of Mr. Stephen Yanetovich for the past two years, has become a very prominent part of the school and community life of Clearwater. The band plays regularly at all football games, school assemblies, other school activities, and frequent radio broadcasts. It appears during the winter season as an attraction for visitors and home folks in many colorful parades and Sunday afternoon concerts. During the present year the band has travelled over 2,000 miles playing in Tallahassee, Tampa, St. Petersburg, Sarasota, Ft. Myers and other key cities of Florida. The band appeared in the District Contest at Winter Haven and was awarded a first division rating in marching.

Mr. Stephen Yanetovich, the director, is a graduate of Indiana University with a B.P.S.M. degree. He has studied also at Northwestern University, Boguslawski College of Music and attended Columbia School of Music on a scholarship. Mr. Yanetovich was a charter member of Sinfonia when it was introduced at Indiana University. He has been a member and guest director of symphony orches-

tras in South Bend, Indiana; Spokane, Washington, and Chicago.

Cocoa High School Band

ROBERT ROTH, Director

Only eighteen months ago, this band was organized, without funds, band experience, instruments or uniforms. This surely was a case of starting with nothing except a willingness to work and a confidence they could achieve their objective. In a short time our local civic clubs put their shoulders to the wheel and funds were available for uniforms and instruments for those not owning their own.

By hard work on the part of the band members and their director they were awarded Third Division in the Distict Contest held in Ocala last February, six months

after the band was organized.

Robert Roth, the director, has a B.A. degree from Lake Forest College and has studied at the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago. During the war he served as a pilot in the A. A. F. for four years.

De Land High School Band

JOHN J. HENEY, Director

De Land High School has an erollment for 1948-49 of 383 students and in addition to its band is famous for its football team, agriculture department, and high

scholarship.

The band, organized in August of 1936, is a well equipped unit, having a completely balanced instrumentation. In addition to scientific tuning devices such as the stroboscope, record-making equipment, and its own building, the band travels in its specially equipped busses. These busses have every modern convenience for the comfort of its travelers, including a small hospital. Builtin bunks have innerspring mattresses to make the sick comfortable while the band is en route.

In nine years of competition during which the band has entered 48 events it has received the highest rating of first division 46 times and on one occasion a second

rating and on another a third rating.

This year De Land High School Band made its Fifth Annual Tour, traveling some 1,200 miles. The group gave sixteen performances during the week it was away from school.

Delray Beach High School Band

RAY DEMARIS, Director

city and attended the University of Miami on a four-year music scholarship award. He played solo cornet with the University Symphony Orchestra and the University Symphonic Band under directors Arnold Volpe and Walter Schaeffer. Immediately prior to his graduation with a B.A. in Music in 1938, Mr. McComb took over the Fort Lauderdale Band and has been its director since that time. He will receive his M.A. in Guidance and Administration from the University of Michigan this summer. Mr. McComb is a charter member of the Miami chapter Phi Mu Alpha (professional music honorary), a Kiwanian, and president of the Florida Bandmasters Association.

Besides consistently receiving First Division ratings at district, state and regional (national) contests from nationally-known bandsmen, the Fort Lauderdale Band plays a large part in school and community life. Football games are enlivened by the stirring music and elaborate half-time shows planned and presented by the band. The concert band plays six assemby programs a year, and the dance band presents other assembly programs and

plays for dances and patio parties.

In community life parades, premieres, and patriotic events request the Band's services. Every two weeks during the winter season the Band, sponsored by the City Parks Board, presents a park concert for the enjoyment of winter visitors and local residents alike. The Band participates in the Orange Bowl Festivities and climaxes its year of varied activities with its outstanding annual Spring Concert.

Fort Pierce High School Band

MAJOR J. B. O'NEAL, Director

The Fort Pierce High School Band which has consistently rated First Division in State and National Festivals is a very prominent part of Fort Pierce's school and community life. The Band plays regularly at all of the football games, school assemblies and other school activities. It appears regularly during the winter season as an attraction for visitors and home folks. It plays an important part in the Easter Sunrise Service each year, and until the war participated in the Orange Bowl festivities.

Major J. B. O'Neal has been Director of the Fort Pierce High School Band since 1938. He was born in Troy, Alabama, and has been associated with some of the best concert bands and orchestras in the South. He has done extensive study at Conn National School of Music and Vandercook School of Music in Chicago. He was for four summers a member of the faculty at the University of North Carolina and for the past six summers assistant camp director, Transylvania Music School Camp, Brevard, North Carolina. Beginning July 5th will be associated with the University of Miami Summer Band Camp for high school students, July 5th to August 9th, as assistant director.

Haines City High School Band

ALTON L. RINE, Director

Alton L. Rine, Director of Music at Haines City for the past three years, is a graduate of the University of Tampa at Tampa, Florida. At the present time, the Haines City School Band Department has a concert band of 60 members and a beginners band of 35 members. The concert band plays regularly at all of the football games, school assemblies, and other school activities. It plays an important part in the Easter Sunrise Service each year,

and presents a series of Sunday afternoon concerts as an attraction for visitors and home folks.

During the past three years, the people of Haines City have contributed nearly \$9,000 for the purchase of instruments and uniforms. The band took First Division in all events at the District 3 Festival at Winter Haven.

Hillsborough High School Band

AMADO DELGADO, Director

The Band of Hillsborough was organized after a long line of outstanding orchestras had made the school famous in the music field. Amado Delgado, present director of music, first took over his position at Hillsborough seventeen years ago. Since then he has been steadily building up the music department. This year the band is one of the best bands ever to represent Hillsborough at a contest.

Andrew Jackson Senior High School Band (Jax)

MILTON B. WEARY, Director

Milton B. Weary, Band Director at the Andrew Jackson High School, Jacksonville, was born in Chicago. Illinois, June 22, 1902, and commenced the study of violin at the age of six under his father. While attending the University of Illinois he played 'cello in the University Orchestra and was admitted, during his freshman year, to the famous University of Illinois Band under the direction of Dr. A. A. Harding. He then played bassoon in the Chicago Civic Orchestra and the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, and enlisted in the U. S. Marine Band in June of 1924. He served as bassoonist in the band and White House Orchestra until November, 1932.

He played in the San Diego and San Francisco Symphony Orchestras. During the war, Mr. Weary served as an instructor in the Fleet School of Music in San Diego and at the Naval Air Station at Jacksonville, Florida. He was appointed to his present position at the Andrew Jack-

son High School in 1945.

Ketterlinus High School Band (St. Augustine)

HERBERT M. KING, Director

Since its first rehearsal in January of 1946, the Ketterlinus High School Band has made rapid strides toward its goal of becoming a straight first division band in the state band contest. Three months after its organization the band received a first division rating in concert at the 1946 contest held in St. Petersburg. Since that time the band has won first division ratings at three consecuive Fifth District Band Festivals, the most recent of these accomplishments being made only last March at the University of Florida.

The Ketterlinus High School Band has been very generous about making public appearances for all local parades, holiday activities, and sports events. The band is justly proud of its unique record of three international radio broadcasts. These broadcasts were beamed to Latin America over "The Voice of America" and originated at the Inter-American Center of Florida in St. Augustine.

Kinloch Park Junior High School Band, Miami, was organized in September, 1947. After the usual hardships and lack of equipment, the band entered its first district 1 contest in March, 1949, after one and one-half years of playing, and received a 1st division rating.

Bandmaster Stuart D. Wooley is a graduate of Ithaca College, Ithaca, N. Y., B.S. in Music Education. Taught music in New York State schools, Served in U. S. Army Air Corps three and one-half years. Has studied graduate work at University of Miami.

Lakeview High School Band

H. C. HAWN, Director

The history of the band really begins in 1941, with Law Mallard as director. There were only five students who played instruments in the entire school, but in spite of the lack of interest, the school managed to buy a few instruments. A few of the townspeople donated old instruments from their attics and gradually more and more interest was shown.

The first Band Association began in '44 and '45 but

the real interest was shown in 1946.

The next hard struggle was to get uniforms. The Association managed to raise enough money for twenty uniforms. Ten new ones were added during each of the next years. We then had to outfit a marching band.

Lake Wales High School Band

O. J. KRAUSHAAR, Director

The Lake Wales High School Band was organized in 1938 with Harry Grant, Jr., director. Mr. Kraushaar came to Lake Wales in 1941. The band plays for school activities—assembly programs, athletic events, various school pageants, and for community affairs as well as out-of-town activities. It also plays a series of Sunday vesper concerts during the winter season and an annual Fillmore concert in the spring. The band moved into its

own new building a year ago.

Mr. Kraushaar, supervisor of music in Lake Wales Schools, is a graduate of Sherwood Music School in Chicago and has had additional college training at the University of Wisconsin and the University of Iowa. During World War I he played in the band on the U.S.S. Flagship Pennsylvania. He has played concert seasons with the Canadian Kilties Band, the Chicago Band, and four concert tours with the Sousa Band. He was supervisor of instrumental music in the LaGrange County, Indiana Schools for seven years—supervisor of music in the Waupun, Wisconsin schools for seven years-and has been supervisor of music in the Lake Wales Schools for eight years. He has been director of the Band Division of the Summer Music Camp at Florida State University for seven years.

Robert E. Lee High School Band (Jax) ROBERT SMITH, Director

Reorganized in 1946, the band has grown from 35 players to its present 80 and for the third year in succession will be competing in the State Festival.

Last year the band made sixty public appearances at football games, parades, civic functions and concerts,

thus contributing its share in civic affairs.

Mr. Robert Smith, the director, came to Lee High in September, 1946, where he assumed the duties of Director of Music. His early musical training was received in Great Britain at the Paisley School of Music. The Scottish National Academy of Music, The Royal Academy of Music, London, and St. Andrews University where he had a Carnegie Scholarship.

He studied with Tobias Matthay, John Barlirolli, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Sir Hugh S. Roberton and other well-known British musicians.

Since coming to Jacksonville, Mr. Smith has organized and directs The Jacksonville Junior Symphony Orchestra, The Jacksonville Boys' Choir and is Organist and Choir Director at Hendricks Memorial Methodist Church.

Leesburg High School Band

H. GRAHAM SELICK, Director

Organized in Class "C" by Harry Parker in 1939. H. Graham Selick took over in 1940 and band attended Region 8 national contest in Richmond, Virginia, making 2nd in concert and first in drill.

Selick went in the Army in 1941 and until he returned in 1946 this organization was kept intact by Gene Sturchio. During the past three years it has been reorganized and the musical standard raised in line with the larger and best bands in the state.

Melbourne High School Band

DOROTHY L. PARKER, Director

The Melbourne High School Band participated in National and State Contests 1938-41, and was consistently awarded a First Division rating. From 1941-45 the band was at a standstill, and dropped in enrollment from 90 pieces to 7 pieces. The band was reorganized 1945-46 under the direction of its present director, Dorothy L. Parker, and now maintains a membership in the concert band of 65 students, and 55 in the marching band.

The drill band has Mr. Chick Catterton as its drill master. Under his expert drilling the band has been consistently awarded a "I" rating in the District and State

contests of 1946 and 1947.

Melbourne Band represented the Florida State Lions in New York this past summer, as the official Florida

Lions Band.

The Director of the Melbourne Band, Dorothy L. Parker, is a graduate of the University of Illinois. She taught in Missouri; was a member of the Missouri State Board of Music; Director of Instrumental Music in Shelby, N. C.—supervising band in seven grade schools, junior high and senior high. Secretary of the North Carolina Bandmasters Association, and was Dean of Girls and Instructor of Music at Transylvania Music Camp, Brevard, North Carolina.

Ada Merritt Junior High School Band JESSE BLUM, Director

Now in its fifth year, the Ada Merritt Junior High School Band was organized by its present director. It has consistently made high ratings in district and state competitions.


The instrumental department now consists of a training band, a reserve band, and the concert band as well as a string class. There are 160 students presently enrolled

Miami Jackson High School Band STEFAN JONES, Director

The Miami Jackson Band is one of the most active bands in Florida.

This year the band has participated in the Orange Bowl parade and pageant; Tampa and Ft. Myers parades; staged the half-time Christmas extravaganza for the Shrine All-Star football game; attended the Havana Carnival as guest of the Cuban government, and is one of three Florida bands to be sent by the Florida Lions to their international convention in New York City this summer.

The Miami Jackson Band takes an active part in all district and state contests.

Director Stephan Jones, A.B., B.S., in Music Education, Phi Mu Alpha, National Sinfonia, formerly of the Columbus, Ohio, schools, is a graduate of Ohio State University.

He assumed the direction of the Miami Jackson Band in September, 1944. He originated and introduced the Dancing Majorettes, and has pioneered in featuring swing and dancing on the gridiron and at parades.

The popular and modern Baton Ballet is a regular feature of the band.

Their original routines are designed by Stefan Jones, who developed and introduced the Dancing Majorettes to Miami football fans in 1944.

Miami Senior High School Band

AL G. WRIGHT, Director

The Miami Senior High School "Stingaree" Band directed by Al G. Wright has achieved an impressive record of activities and accomplishments during the past decade.

With its auxiliary organizations, the Stingaree Band numbers around two hundred and ten students. Of the total, one hundred and fifty are bandsmen, the remaining students being members of marching units—Majorettes, Twirlers, Swiss Flag Swingers, and United Nations Color Guard.

The hundred and fifty musicians called the "Marching Band" are divided into two smaller groups, a "Concert Band" and a "Stingaree Band" for the purpose of facilitating rehearsal and administrative problems.

The Miami High Band has been and is a regular participant in District, State and Regional (National) Band Contests and in them has accumulated an impressive total of first division (superior) ratings in Concert, Marching, and Sight-reading events. Playing for nationally recognized band judges including Henry Fillmore (President, American Bandmasters Association); Clenn Cliff Bainum (Northwestern University); William Revelli (University of Michigan); A. A. Harding (Illinois) and the composer Paul Yoder: the Stingaree Band has received noteworthy comments and enthusiastic acclaim.

The Miami High Band regularly participates in community and educational activities in cities throughout the State of Florida and is in constant demand for appearances in home-town Miami.

These one hundred and fifty student musicians together with the dancing majorettes, twirlers, flag spinners, and other colorful units have made an outstanding impression on Miami Football Fans.

Al Wright has served in the capacity of Director of Music at Miami Senior High School for the past ten years where he conducts the Band and Orchestra.

He studied French Horn with James Stagliano, Piano

and Theory with Franklin Harris, and conducting under Arnold Volpe. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Miami in 1937 with a major in Public School Music, and recently received a M. E. degree with a major in supervision and administration. He has served as visiting lecturer at Stetson University and the University of Miami; on the Summer Music Camp faculty at Florida State University; as guest conductor of the Kansas University Band, the Stetson Summer Camp Chorus and the University of Miami Band.

Mr. Wright is a past president of the Florida Bandmasters Association and is at present serving third term as president of the Florida Orchestra Association. He was recently elected to full membership in the American Bandmaster Association.

He has for several years been a member of the excutive board of the Florida Music Educators Association. In the summer of 1948 he was invited to serve in the preparation of the Florida State Course of Study for Music.

He is pageant director for the annual Miami Kiwanis charity football game and designed and directed the original pageants for the Mahi Shrine Christmas game. He has played horn professionally with the University of Miami Symphony Orchestra and the Miami Opera Guild.

Mr. Wright has served as an adjucator in nearly all of Florida's six district Band, Orchestra, and Solo Contests. He is a charter member of the Beta Tau Chapter of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, National honorary Music fraternity.

Miami Senior High School Orchestra

AL G. WRIGHT, Director

The Miami Senior High School Orchestra, under the direction of Al G. Wright, has consistently made highest ratings in district and state contest participation during its many years of existence. Last year this group received a first division in the concert and sight-reading events for Class A at the State Orchestra contest.

Made up of eighty members, this the Miami High Orchestra has its own officers who work with members of the Band Council and the Director. These officers form an active and successful student governing group within the orchestra. The council plans the orchestra's many activities, sets up standards of dress and behavior and in many ways has helped build the Orchestra into a fine playing and well behaved group of young men and women.

The string section meets daily during school time with Associate Director Gladys Ditsler in intermediate and advanced string classes. These string classes have contributed immensely to the improvement of the orchestra.

The Orchestra has a full symphonic instrumentation including a large string section and Harps.

Ocala High School Band

LELAND H. ARMSTRONG, Director

The Ocala High School Band is the oldest organized high school band in the state of Florida, being organized in 1922 by Mrs. B. G. Cole. Mrs. Cole was the director of this band until her retirement in 1943, when Mr. Leland (Pop) Armstrong was hired as the band director and director of music in the Ocala schools. The Ocala band has grown during these years and today is recognized as one of the better high school bands in the state. They are very active in their civic and school duties and for the tourists of Ocala play a regular concert schedule of

15 concerts every Thursday evening in the Civic Park Band Shell. Football, parades and any activity that demands the use of the band will find them busy and on the job. They have an active alumnae membership of over 2,000 at the present time.

Leland (Pop) Armstrong came to Ocala in 1943 from Indiana, where he had been Music Supervisor in the Bedford public schools for 15 years previous to 1943. Before that time, when he went into school work he played professionally with such bands as Sousa, Liberatti, Thaviu, Innes and Kryl. He was also connected with work of orchestras in theater work, being one of the members of the famous orchestra that traveled with the film—"The Birth of a Nation." The band now has a playing membership of 65 students.

Pahokee High School Band

ROBERT O. LAMPI, Director

The Pahokee High School Band was reorganized May 10, 1940 and placed under the direction of R. O. Lampi. Rehearsals were continued through the summer and the band was ready to perform for the football season of 1940. Since then the Band has performed, playing and marching, during every football season at home games and away from home. In the Contest Festival held in St. Petersburg in 1941, Pahokee entered as a class D Band. It won 1st division in marching, 3rd in concert and sightreading.

Robert O. Lampi was born in Mohawk, Michigan. He started the study of piano at the age of 12. He attended Northern Michigan College of Education at Marquette, Michigan, where he majored in music, graduating with a B.S. Degree. Upon first coming to Florida he taught music at Gulf High School, New Port Richey, for three years. In the spring of 1940 he reorganized the Pahokee High School Band with which organization he has been ever since. He served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Florida Bandmasters Association from 1945 through 1947.

Palm Beach High School Band HOWARD B. SWYERS, Director

The present Palm Beach High School Band was organized under the direction of Howard B. Swyers in September, 1944, when some 35 odd students reported for rehearsal with a nondescript array of instruments. Today's group numbers 85 members with three junior high groups being organized for feeders into the "Wildcat" band. At present the band owns \$23,000 worth of instruments, uniforms and other equipment.

Being extremely active in civic affairs the band made over 80 appearances last year. Among these appearances were park concerts each Sunday afternoon during the season.

Plant City High School Band CLARENCE JASMAGY, Director

The Plant City High School Band, one of the most active in Florida, has made considerable progress in the past few years.

Clarence Jasmagy, the director for the past eight years, is a graduate of New York University, school of Music Education. He has taught music at Long Beach, New York, for three years, as well as seven years at Westhampton Beach, Long Island, New York. He has also taught at Greigsville, New York and Roslyn, Long Island, before coming to Florida.

Quincy High School Band

H. CARLTON MASON, Director

The Quincy High School Band was organized Oct. 1st 1940 by its present Director. It is composed of 69 members and competes in Class "CC." The Band has placed in First Division in its class since its organization, in both playing and drilling.

Sebring High School Band

P. J. GUSTAT, Director

The Sebring School Band was organized in 1926, sponsored by the Sebring Rotary Club. In 1927, the band entered the state Festival Contest and received the highest award in Class B. The judges sought Mr. Gustat, the director, after the contest, and asked that the band move up to Class A. In 1928 the band participated in Class A, and carried off the highest honors and continued to do so until 1936 when the division system was adopted. The band was permitted to stay in Class A, and up to the present time it has successively made a 1 division, the highest rating.

It must be remembered that the Sebring school has less than 200 in the Senior High School (10-11-12 grades) and has competed in the class of schools with 750 and above.

The Sebring Band, under the direction of P. J. Gustat, is a pioneer in the Florida Music field. It has been an inspiration to many schools in the state. The band plays 12 open air concerts during the winter season—January 1st to April 1st—at the city's beautiful Municipal Pier where capacity crowds are entertained.

P. J. Gustat, director, Sebring High School Band, was formerly conductor, El Paso, Texas, Symphony Orchestra and Municipal Band; formerly president Florida Bandmasters Association; formerly president Florida Music Educators Association; formerly chairman Music Division, Florida Education Association, and formerly chairman, District II, Florida Bandmasters Association.

Shenandoah Junior High School Band

LAURENCE TREMBLAY, Director

The Shenandoah Band was organized in 1941 under the direction of Laurence Tremblay, it's present Bandmaster. It has participated in district and state contests since that time, always emerging with the highest ratings. Ninety-five per cent of its students enter The Miami Senior High School after graduating.

Many former Shenandoah Band members are now enrolled in our leading university and college bands throughout the South, while others are playing professionally in the Miami area.

St. Cloud High School Band

CHARLOTTE COOPER, Director

This year has been a banner year for the St. Cloud Band. It was able to procure the use of school busses for out of town trips which has been a setback for several years; got a band building by completely remodelling a large barracks building, and received all firsts at the district contest, in class C, for the first time in history.

Organized in 1942, under the direction of Miss Opal Beville, it has increased from twenty-five to fifty-five members. Miss Charlotte Cooper became director of the band in the fall of 1946 and the band drilled at all football games for the first time.

Civic and school activities and Sunday afternoon concerts keep the band busy from September till June.



St. Petersburg High School Band

EVERETT L. ROBERTS, Director

Everett L. Roberts, bandmaster of the St. Petersburg High School Band is a charter member of the Florida Bandmasters Association. He received his education at Rollins College, Winter Park, Florida, where he received the Bachelor of Music degree. He also attended the Vander Cook School of Music in Chicago and will receive the Master of Arts degree from Stetson University during the summer of 1949.

Mr. Roberts started instructing bands in 1935 at Avon Park High School, Avon Park, Florida, where he remained fo seven years. In 1942 he moved to Winter Park, Florida, as director of both Rollins College and

Winter Park High School.

In February, 1943, Mr. Roberts entered the armed service as a private. He served four years in the signal corps two years being overseas duty in the Pacific. He was separated from the service with the rank of Captain.

This year is the first that Mr. Roberts has been at St. Petersburg and the result of his efforts is shown in the steady progress of the band.

Thomas Jefferson High School Band

ROBERT T. SCOTT, Director

The Jefferson High School Band was organized in September, 1942, under the direction of Mrs. Sara Tyler Webb. In 1945 Miss Elenor Fisk became the director. In 1946 Mr. Robert T. Scott became the director and is still the director of the band. The band had entered contests only twice before under Mr. Scott's direction. Once under the direction of Mrs. Webb and one with Miss Fisk.

The band is a class A band and has entered contest for their second time under Mr. Scott. Both in 1948 and 1949 they won a first division in district. And both times have entered into the state contest.

In the last three years the band has not only improved in playing ability, but has grown in enrollment and popularity. There have been many more calls for the band and they have participated in many of the fine programs throughout the state.

Vero Beach High Schol Band

ROBERT E. LEE, Director

The Vero Beach High School Band was organized in 1936 by Mr. and Mrs. James Crowley and was sponsored by the Vero Beach High School Band Association.

In 1937 and 1938 the band made first division in the National Contest of Region Eight. The band also made first division in the National Contest held in Richmond, Virginia, in 1941. At that time the band was under the direction of Mr. Carl Hulbert.

Under Mr. Lee's skillful direction, the band steadily improved. In 1947 the band made second division in Sebring, and in 1948 they made second division at Fort Myers. This year the band made first division at Vero Beach.

At the present, the Vero Beach High School Band consists of a 42-piece concert band and a 36-piece drilling band. The band uniforms are red and white.

Robert E. Lee, the director, was born in Atlanta, Ga., receiving elementary and high school education in the Fulton County school system. Received A.B. degree from

Oglethorpe University in 1926. Studied music at the Atlanta Conservatory of Music. Played in Atlanta Symphony Orchestra several years and various theaters in the south. A member American Federation of Musicians for past 34 years.

Winter Haven High School Band

ROY V. WOOD, Director

The Winter Haven High School Band is a comparatively young group, having been organized about eight years ago. The present director is completing his seventh year with the Winter Haven band.

During the past years the band has established itself in the community life by playing a regular concert series in the city as well as a regular series in the school system. They provide programs for civic clubs and furnish personnel for parades and special services during the course of the year's activities. The band appears annually in a dozen Florida Cities and has participated in many special events such as the Orange Bowl, Tangerine Bowl, Gasparilla, Pageant of Light, Sara De Sota Pageant, Florida Citrus Exposition, etc. The band is a strong supporter of the program of the Florida Bandmasters Association and has participated in all festivals since it was organized. The band makes an average of eighty public appearances per year with an average loss of only four days school time per year. Educational advantages of the experiences gained by the band activities are considered an outstanding contribution to the development of the students.

The High School has a total of two hundred band students of which eighty make up the concert band and seventy-two make up the junior band. The rest are beginners.

Band director is Roy V. Wood, present treasurer of the Florida Bandmasters Association. Mr. Wood received his education in Marion Military Institute, Marion, Alabama and in Florida State University in Tallahassee. He played professionally for several years before going into the field of education.

Winter Park High School Band

EDGAR W. WILLIAMS, Director

The Winter Park High School Band was organized in 1935 by Mr. Gene Sturchio. Mr. Sturchio was succeeded by Mr. Everett L. Roberts in 1942. During Mr. Roberts' tour of duty in the Signal Corps of the U. S. Army, his duties as bandmaster were carried out by Mr. J. M. Prasek. Mr. Roberts returned in 1946 and the band, under his direction, participated in their first district festival gaining first division in drill and second division in playing and sight reading. The following year the band obtained first division ratings in concert and drill and second division in sight reading and as a consequence went to the State Contest in Tampa for the first time; obtaining a second division and two third divisions.

Mr. Roberts was succeeded by Mr. Edgar W. Williams. Under Mr. Williams the band participated in the District Festival in February, 1949, placing first in all three divisions; thereby earning once more the opportunity to participate in the State Festival May 12, 13, 14, 1949.

Bandmaster Edgar Warren Williams received an A.B. degree in music from the University of Tampa and served there for two years in the capacity of Assistant Director. He joined the Naval Air Corps in 1942 and served for four years as a pilot. He was awarded the Navy Air Medal and four Army Air Medals for his rescue work and activities as a night bomber pilot in the Southwest Pacific.






