REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES:

FBA MENTORING COMMITTEE REPORT Travis A. Henry, Chairperson JULY BOARD MEETING - JULY 10, 2013

Here is a brief update on activities that the committee performed this past year.

Only a few members responded to the questions that we posed at the first FBA meetings last year. While those members all believe that the FBA is an important professional organization that works hard to provide meaningful professional development and camaraderie across the state, those members believe that more needs to be done with making everyone aware of what is needed for success at our music performance assessments. One member expressed concerns that the FBA may interfere too much with the autonomy of individual band programs.

Members also expressed concerns about not enough opportunities for younger directors to be involved in decision making/leadership within our organization. They suggested having more of

- an emphasis of creating those opportunities at the district level (assisting host directors with events, helping to organize events, etc.)
- Some district have expressed concerns over which ratings are assigned, and there is a perception that fewer bands are earning the highest ratings. The committee is currently looking at data for the past two years, and hoping to shape some future clinics that will assist directors with their assessment preparations and strategies.

The committee will work to provide the following clinics at future conferences:

- How to Listen Like An Adjudicator (in possible conjunction with Adjudication Committee
- What Do You Hear: An Interactive Approach to Understanding Adjudication

The goal of these clinics is to give members a taste of the Adjudication Training Sessions, if they cannot attend the sessions in July or January. By doing so, members would feel more informed and educated going into the MPA process.

Second/Third Bands - can choose their classification, but will sight-read at MD unless. The director may request to sight-read at a higher level.

Rationale: Setting a new standard for MS Concert MPA is to show constant learning gains, annual yearly progress, and to align the progression from middle school to high school. The alignment from MS to HS is faulty. Ninth graders have to perform at least a grade 3 solo, so in 8th grade the minimum standard should be a grade 2 solo. That grade 2 solo will be more difficult than a grade 2 piece of concert music so a minimum concert requirement of two grade 2's is a reasonable expectation for eighth graders.

If a school has only two concert bands, classification for the second band will be C (grade 2 & 3 minimum).

If a school has three concert bands, classification for the second band will be CC (grade 3 & 3 minimum); classification for the third band will be C (grade 2 & 3).

All second/third/fourth bands will sight-read at the C/CC level (remains the same).

Sight-reading levels:

D, C/CC, B/BB, A- remain the same

Rationale: FBA understands that directors do not have access to the total school population due to a variety of factors (ie. intensive reading, intensive math, standardized testing, etc...).

Other recommendations:

Eliminate classification for jazz bands.

Rationale: There is no music list for jazz band - directors can play whatever they want. The handbook currently allows districts to vote on how they want to schedule MPA events.

State Concert MPA - minimum music requirement of two grade 3's or higher to attend.

Rationale: The committee believes that grade 2 music is not appropriate literature for performance at the Florida Bandmasters Association "premiere" Concert Music Performance Assessment.

Notes:

The Request for Classification is still in place and will now be in effect for middle schools. Nothing has changed to the JS/C or JS/CC levels.

Modify-III. D. 2. i: From: "With the exception of spoken narration, the use of prerecorded/ sequenced sounds will not be permitted."

To: "Prerecorded spoken narration is allowed, but the use of prerecorded music will not be permitted."

Rationale: The last sentence confuses the intent of the rule. All midi is sequenced sound. Sound effects and synthesized sounds should be allowed, provided that the student is in control of the rhythmic content.
