#### IN MEMORIAM

LAKELAND Brian Edward Hawks, the band director at McKeel Academy of Technology, who brought a sense of spirit to the school, died Saturday, September 1, 2007. He was 29. Hawks, a graduate of the Harrison School for the Arts and Florida Southern College, was in his second year as band director at McKeel. He was known for his skill in playing piano, percussion, and bass guitar. Hawks won the Ruth Eckerd scholarship for classical music, as well as the Young Artist competition in Lakeland when he was in high school. He often participated in orchestra playing the piano, and most recently was furthering his education by taking classes to receive his master's degree in music. He led the school's drum line, pep squad and jazz band. "Brian was creative, very likeable and a hard worker willing to do anything for the kids," McKeel Principal Harold Maready said. "He even had his own music published. It's very sad. He had such a promising career ahead of him." Emily Backes, Brian's sister, said her brother was passionate about his work. "I've never seen anybody so happy to be at work". "He loved those kids." Every so often, her brother's band would have an epiphany and ace a difficult piece of music. And when they did, she said, Hawks would come running to her and say, "Bring the whole chorus in - you've got to hear the band play." This is what some of his student's said about him. "He made me appreciate the beauty in music". "He was always full of energy and humor, and did awesome impersonations. He always believed in each of us." "Mr. Hawks epitomized as a colleague and as a teacher the saying 'It is in giving oneself that one receives,' " said a 10th-grade English teacher. The community's response to the tragedy is a testament to Hawks' impact on the people who knew him. The Band Masters Association of Polk County, of which Hawks was a member, came together to provide consistent musical education for the band students of McKeel. Several band directors from around Polk County have taught the band while the administration searched for a replacement.

BOKEELIA Mickey Wayne Young, 70, of Bokeelia, Fla., passed away to be with our Lord on Tuesday, Oct. 16, 2007. He was born to Robert W. Young Jr. and Martha Elizabeth Martin Young on April 7, 1937, in Winston-Salem, N.C. He was a member of the Moravian Church, which fostered and encouraged his early and abiding love for music. As early as age 15, Mickey was playing trombone with society dance bands. Following graduation from RJ Reynolds High School, Mickey studied at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He then served in the U.S. Army based in Germany. He graduated from Appalachian State Teachers College and earned his master's degree from the University of Illinois. Mickey's true calling to teach resulted in a career of teaching band, first in Granite Falls and then a long career teaching band in Salisbury, N.C. schools. Mickey volunteered in Lee County, Fla. schools following retirement. He also arranged music for both band and chorus. He will be fondly remembered by his students and the communities in which he lived. Mickey served many professional organizations. The American School Band Directors' Association awarded Mickey their highest honor, the Edwin Franco Goldman Award in 2005. Mickey enjoyed travel, photography, nature and people and was a lifelong learner. Music was his passion. Mickey was dedicated to his wife Cheryl (Showalter) Young, family, extended family and friends. If there is a problem with your student's listing or with All-State attendance, Contact Mr. **Shawn Barat** IMMEDIATELY so that substitutions can be made (SCHOOL: **904-346-5620x233**; HOME: **904-221-5951**). DO NOT ALLOW STUDENTS OR PARENTS TO CALL. DIRECTORS MUST **NOT** MAKE SUBSTITUTIONS.

**REMEMBER**: Students MAY be re-auditioned at the Clinic for seating within each section or subsection (i.e., 2nd trumpets, etc.) at the discretion of the Conductor/Clinician. Re-auditions will consist of the music to be performed by the Band, and possibly some scales to break ties. Please check all schedules and have your student at the proper place at the proper time; HAVE YOUR STUDENT PREPARED so that this will be a positive musical experience for all involved.

**MUSIC**, chair position and a congratulatory letter for students will be mailed to the director's school address.

**PERCUSSIONISTS** ARE REQUIRED TO BRING SPECIFIED INSTRUMENTS AND EQUIPMENT WITH THEM. The list of individual percussion equipment that has been assigned to the percussionists in each band is in the music packets. The Band Coordinator and a member of the All-State Selections Committee will verify that these items have been brought. If additional equipment must be purchased at the clinic, because assigned equipment is not brought, the school of the student responsible for bringing the equipment will be charged. This happened a few years ago and cost FBA over \$500.00 for equipment not being brought to the clinic that was assigned. Please read carefully, all percussionists.

## **DIRECTORS**: YOU ARE ASKED TO ASSIST YOUR STUDENTS IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS: PREPARE THE MUSIC!!

Be sure percussionists bring the equipment assigned to them.

Make your students (and yourself) familiar with Clinic rules. (Infractions of these rules usually result in the student being dismissed from the band and being sent home.)

Impress upon them the need to **be on time** for rehearsals and performances. Students are expected to **be seated** prior to the starting time.
