Michael J. Dzoba, 56, of Plantation, FL passed away suddenly Thursday, September 2, 2004. Mike is survived by his loving wife of 30 years Nancy; sons, Matthew and Steven; daughter Katherine, and granddaughter Bethany. Mike was a teacher in the Broward School system for 34 years. He was the band director at Seminole Middle School in Plantation where he shared his love of music with thousands of students.
