Please read them carefully and thoroughly, so that you can come to the F.B.A. Clinic General Business Meeting on Thursday night, very well informed as to what is transpiring in F.B.A., and be able to vote intelligently on matters of utmost importance to you, your students, and the Band Program in the State of Florida. Be sure to read the Proposed Revised F.B.A. Constitution completely so you can vote on that. It is Appendix "D" at the end of the minutes.

If you have purchased the new 1977 Edition of the F.B.A. Official Music List, you will receive in the mail, hopefully, before the January Clinic, the New Annual 1977-78 Supplement for Band, free of charge. The Supplement for '77-'78 Solos and Ensembles seemed to have developed into a greater project and supplemental list than cold be gotten ready by Clinic. That will be published some time in the future. In order to receive the 1977-78 Supplement, you must have purchased the new 1977 Revised Edition. The Edition is \$12.00 to F.B.A. members and \$15.00 to non-F.B.A. members, payable in advance, and is purchased from your State Executive Secretary, Robert Lampi, Box 666, Pahokee, Florida 33476.

REMEMBER ---- the dates of the F.B.A. Clinic are January 5, 6, & 7, 1977 --the place is Orlando -- The Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge is the F.B.A. Headquarters - just off I - 4, and south of the Florida Turnpike I - 4 Exit. Both the

but no hats. Hope you pre-registered for the Clinic - it will save you much time in

Area. Admission to these is by CLINIC BADGE ONLY.

NEW PROPOSALS from the Districts.

New Proposals that were tabled and referred back to the Districts for Discussion and Poll.

#1. Kroeze made a motion, seconded by Herron, giving the following All-State Audition Proposal: -

ALL STATE AUDITION PROPOSAL

Establish fourteen (14) District Bands, four (4) Regional Bands, and one (1) All-State Band divided into Concert and Reading. Bands would be seated by live auditions using published materials.

Best ranked players from District would become members of the Regional Band; best ranked players from Region, the All-State Bands. Rankings for All-State would be held on Thursday prior to the Clinic. The entire packet of All-State Selections would be made available at the conclusion of the Regional Band Auditions to all persons who advance to State and would be the basis for All-State rankings.

All-District Auditions would be held by the end of the first week in December. Regional Bands would meet the second week in December, therefore all All-State band members would have their music by the end of the second week in December so they could practice for the final rankings.

Examples:

Trumpets:

16 trumpets would be selected for All-District Band. The best four (4) would advance to Region and be seated with the other twelve (12) from the other Districts. After the seating, eight (8) of the players would advance to State along with the eight (8) from each of the other three (3) Regions for a total of thirty-two (32) All-State trumpets.

Oboes, Bassoons:

4 Oboes and 4 Bassoons would be selected for All-District Band. The best Oboe and the best Bassoon would advance to Regional Band and be seated with the players from the other Districts. After ranking the Regional Players, the best two Oboes, and the best two Bassoons would advance to All-State along with the two Oboes and two Bassoons from each of the other three regions for a total of eight (8) All-State players on each instrument.

For the purposes of this Audition only, it is strongly recommended that the present fourteen (14) Districts be slightly rearranged so that there are only twelve (12) All-State Districts. This rearrangement would not affect any other aspect of the FBA.

Herron made a motion, seconded by Cannon, that the above proposal be tabled and taken to the Districts for Discussion and Poll. Passed U.

- #2. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Smith, that the Inspection at Marching Contest be eliminated. Herron made a motion to table, seconded by Kaminsky, to take to the Districts. Passed U.
- #3. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Kaminsky, that the number of judges judging drill at the Marching Contest be increased from present number of three. Curry made a motion to table, seconded by Kirk and passed U.
- #4. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Curry, that complimentary copy of literature not be required to be furnished to the music selection committee, as a criteria for selection. Motion by Herron to table, seconded by Carmichael. Passed U.
- "5. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Hendon, that the District Solo/Ensemble be made a State Level activity in lieu of the State Band Festival. Motion to table by Carmichael, seconded by Young. Motion to table carried.

NEW PROPOSALS THAT PASSED.

- #150 Peinberg made a motion, seconded by Cannon, that the old and new music list still be used and when duplication appears on both lists that the grade on the new list be used. Carried.
- #2. Feinberg made a motion, seconded by Clanton, to add more qualified judges to the list of Stage Band adjudicators. Carried.
- #3. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Cannon, that a list of proposed All-State Clinicians be brought before the board from each district and selection be made by the board rather than in the state-wide meetings. Carried.
- #4. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Feinberg, that all Junior and Senior High All-State requirements be printed in its entirety each year. Passed U.
- #5. Polson made a motion, seconded by Kirk, that Music Professionals be paid a fee for professional services rendered for listening to the All-State Band auditions. The fee shall be \$1.00 per student. This will be approximately \$10.00 per hour, which is Union rehearsal scale. Passed U.
- #6. Baker made a motion, seconded by Hendon, that the \$1.00 fee be applied to the entry of all All-State entries to cover the cost of auditioners fee to be paid to F.B.A. (The President was to consult the Committee Chairman for advice as to procedure.) Passed.

NEW PROPOSALS THAT FAILED.

- #1. Varner made a motion, seconded by Cannon, that F.B.A. do everything that can be done to withdraw from F.M.E.A. Clinic and have a separate Clinic. Motion failed.
- $\frac{\pi}{2}$. Smith made a motion, seconded by Kroeze, to separate the State Solo and Ensemble from State Concert Contest. Motion failed.
- #3. Feinberg made a motion, seconded by Hendon, that F.H.S.A.A. be instructed on their calendar set-up to take into consideration major athletic events that are in conflict with music events. Motion failed.
- %4. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Hendon, that at state-wide general meetings, a place be included on the agenda where members may speak to individual items in the minutes after the minutes have been accepted. Motion failed. (The membership already has this privilege.)
- #5. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Kaminsky, that no Florida Band Directors be chosen to direct a Florida All-State Band. Motion failed.
- #6. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that any piece of literature approved to be performed by any soloist, ensemble group, or concert group should be added to the list the following year. Motion failed.
- #7. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Hendon, to have at least one clinic about Stage Band at the Summer Convention. Motion failed.
- #8. Curry made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that F.B.A. look into a feed-back type of evaluation of judges. Motion failed.

NEW PROPOSALS that died for lack of a second.

- #1. Feinberg made a motion, that all majorettes, and auxilliary corps be judged on the field at marching contest and only solos be allowed at solo and ensemble contest, adding one more judge at District Marching Contest for this purpose. This was amended to allow those auxilliary groups whose bands were not performing to perform on the same day as marching contest, prior to the starting time, using the extra judge for this purpose also. Died for lack of a second.
- #2. Feinberg made a motion that middle school entering a second band be allowed to enter them as JF. Died for lack of a second.
- #3. Clanton made a motion, that part of the music played by all-state Bands be chosen by the All-State Chairmen. Died for lack of a second.

NEW PROPOSALS that were referred to their respective Committee.

#1. Varner made a motion, seconded by Cannon, to have three sets of All-State try-out materials to be used on a rotating basis each year with the exception of Sight Reading.

Herron made a motion to table this motion to the Audition Committee for further study. Seconded by Clanton and carried to table

- #2. Varner made a motion, seconded by Carmichael, that the All-State Sight Reading material will not be the same as any year before. Herron made a motion to table this motion to the Audition Committee for further study. Seconded by Carmichael and carried to table.
- #3. Smith made a motion, seconded by Carmichael, to revise the Marching Contest Judges sheets to put equal emphasis on Playing and Marching. Hendon made a motion to table this motion to the Contest Committee. Seconded by Cannon and carried to table.
- #4. Smith made a motion, seconded by Varner, that some form of tangible recognition be given to Superior Marching Bands.

Cannon made a motion, to table this motion to the Marching Band Committee and report at the next Board meeting, seconded by Young. Motion to table carried.

- #5. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Herron, to take to the Board a suggestion that a new criteria for selection of contest literature be made. Cannon made a motion to table the above motion to the Music Selection Committee, seconded by Herror and motion to table passed.
- #6. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Herron, that all F.B.A. Committee members or Committee Chairmen not be allowed to serve in the same capacity more than four consecutive years. Herron made a motion to table the above motion to the Constitution Revision Committee. Seconded by Young, and motion to table carried.
- 7. Wharton made a motion, seconded by Polson, that District 10 recommend to the Board that the Jazz All-State audition materials and procedures be revised, possibly using procedures recommended by the N.A.J.E.

Herron made a motion to table the above motion to the Stage Band Committee, seconded by Hendon. Motion to table carried.

Dear Bob:
This report is made all the easier due to a nice long chat I had with President-elect Herron. We discussed a variety of problems that appeared to be grist for the Summer Convention mill. The primary criteria were that whatever and whoever be practical, current, relevant and reasonable!! With those constraints I see no reason why we can't have another dynamite convention!!

We seemed to settle on three areas that would appear to need our collective and professional attention.

First, the ubiquitous (!) problem of contest ratings and the accompanying problem of regional consistancy. This could be dealt with in any of a number of ways but should include marching and concert performances for sure and probably stage bands, sight reading and inspection. AND THE PLANE OF THE STREET

Second, the responsibilities of the band director and conductor become increasingly complex as the literature we perform becomes ever more sophisticated. There are a number of outstanding conductors who could add much to this dimension of the convention and I would be happy to make that contact and those arrangements.

Third, supervision and administration of band programs is becoming an increasingly perplexing problem (ask any of our few remining supervisors!) and does not provide a very rosy picture for the future. I would like to suggest that we contact a resource who, in my judgment, is one of the truly great supervisors of music in the nation. Ralph Houghton has guided the program at Kenosha, Wisconsin to a level of BM-8

pre-eminence nationally: outstanding performing groups in every area, a terrific elementary music program and an evening enrichment program that is uniquely productive. He is a dynamic speaker and catylytic personality. I personally think this could be a convention highlight long remembered. (He was also a very successful band director!)

Anything beyond these areas, for example, Bill Miller's committee suggestions, surely ought to be incorporated. I conceive my role as chairman of this convention as a facilitator and manager of those activities and interests the FBA wants to address. Let me know and I'll do my best.
