



About the Judges

GLENN CLIFFE BAINUM

Northwestern University

Director Northwestern University Band and Professor of Music, Northwestern University School of Music, Evanston-Chicago, Illinois, since 1926.

Secretary-Treasurer, American Bandmasters' Association since

Graduate of University of Illinois, with degrees A.B. and B.Music. Assistant Diector of University of Illinois Band Department 1922-23. Director of Music, Southern Illinois Normal University 1914 to 1922. Director of Public School Music, Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1924 and 1925.

mer concerts.

Veteran of World Wars I and II. In past war 31/2 years service with over two years duty overseas as Chief of Music Branch,

Hdq. Special Services, European Theater of Operations.

Formerly has served as associate conductor, Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra; Associate Conductor, North Shore Festival Chorus; Director N. U. Men's and Women's Choral organizations, and Summer Session Symphony Orchestra.

HENRY FILLMORE

Henry Fillmore is a band name that is internationally known. He is probably the most prolific writer of band marches since John Philip Sousa. He has been director of the official band of Station WLW and has toured the whole North American continent with the Fillmore Band. His latest ascent to band fame is his recent election at Madison, Wisconsin, to the presidency of the American Bandmaster's Association. He is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers. Henry Fillmore is also President of the Fillmore Music House, Publishers, Cincinnati, Ohio, and has judged many school band festivals.

DR. AUSTIN HARDING

University of Illinois

As the Dean of America's College Bandmasters Dr. Harding has served forty years as Director of Bands at the University of Illinois. Also as Professor of Music. In these years the Department had, before the war, been enlarged to include 360 musicians who comprised the four bands. The Concert Band is famed for its extensive repertoire and excellent musicianship.

John Philip Sousa regarded this Band so highly that he bequeathed his entire library, nine tons of music filling 42 trunks and containing over 3,000 compositions, to the University of Illinois.

Dr. Harding has spent much of his time in arranging and transcribing many of the finest orchestral compositions for the modern symphonic band, thus making available a higher quality of music for bands. Foreign and domestic publishers have consulted him with regard to problems concerning the publication

of band music.

He has been the recipient of two honorary degrees of Doctor of Music, the first being conferred on him by Phillips University

during the Fourth Tri-State Band Festival.

Dr. Harding is a charter member of the American Bandmasters' Association. In that organization he has served as president, vicepresident, treasurer, member of the board of directors and chairman of the college and school band music committee. For many years he served as chairman of the Contest Music Committee for the National School Band Association.

WILLIAM M. KUNKEL

University of New Mexico

Mr. William M. Kunkel is director of Band and instructor of theory and band instruments at the University of New Mex-

ico, Albuquerque.

Mr. Kunkel was born in Waterbury, Connecticut, and began the study of music at the age of eleven, playing the flute and later the violin. As many other famous musicians, Mr. Kunkel began touring the country at the early age of sixteen, playing at resorts and later with chautauqua and other traveling musical

organizations. During the first Wold War he enlisted as a member of the First Recruit Company Band at Fort Slocum, New York. After the war he played with such famous bands as Bachman's Million Dollar Band, Henry Fillmore, John C. Weber, and from 1921 to 1924 Mr. Kunkel was piccolo soloist with the famous John Philip Sousa.

He played under the batons of Ysaye, Reiner and Vander

Stucken, and in the theater orchestra pit under the memorable

Victor Herbert.

His first position with the public schools was as director of the High School Band and Orchestra, Albuquerque, New Mexico, and since 1929 he has been band master at the University. Mr. Kunkel is a member of the American Bandmasters' Asso-

As an adjudicator he has appeared in Texas, Colorado, New

Mexico, Louisiana and Oklahoma.

He organized and is a past president of the New Mexico Instrumental Directors' Association, as well as the first to hold a band clinic in the state. In addition to his positions at the University he is also the director of the Ballut Abyad Shrine Band and was for several years conductor of the Albuquerque Civic Symphony Orchestra.

WILLIAM D. REVELLI

University of Michigan

For more than twenty years William D. Revelli has been one of the guiding forces behind the school band movement, and his vision and ideals are largely responsible for the degree of perfection which the University of Michigan Concert Band has attained.

which the University of Michigan Concert Band has attained. His musical training has been both varied and extensive. He has studied under such outstanding men of music as Felix Borowski, Leon Sametini, George Dasch, H. A. Vandercook, Louis Victor Saar and Charles Spadoni. In 1915 he entered the Beethoven Music Conservatory in St. Louis, Missouri. He continued his education at the Columbia Music School, the Chicago Musical College and the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago, and in 1925 was appointed music supervisor in the public schools of Hobart. Indiana. In the course of his studies at the Columbia school Hobart, Indiana. In the course of his studies at the Columbia school of Music, he had become interested in the school band field and soon after his Hobart appointment, he organized the instrumental music department in that city. In the meantime, he continued his studies at the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago, and during the five years which preceded his coming to Michigan he conducted the Hobart High School Band to five consecutive national championships.

In the fall of 1935 he assumed the duties of conductor of the

University of Michigan Bands and head of the Department of Wind Instruments. The University of Michigan Concert Band has been acclaimed by such eminent musicians and conductors as Dr. Edwin Franko Goldman, Dr. Frank Simon, Roy Harris, Morton Gould, Ferde Grofe, Paul Creston, Henry Cowell and others, as

being without a peer among university bands.

The University of Michigan Marching Band has thrice been named as the "All-American Band" by the press and radio. Bill Stern, Ted Husing, Harry Wismer and other outstanding radio announcers have lauded the Michigan Marching Band as one of


the nation's foremost marching and playing bands.



The Basis of School Band Competition

(From Bulletin of National School Band Association)

"The primary purpose of the school music competition is to serve as a factor in the educational program through the direct values, the inspiration examples and incentives afforded the young people and their teachers and directors. Therefore, adjudication of participants should be regarded as a means for evaluating the progress and musical status of the group or the individual, rather than a mere comparison with other participants to secure an expert opinion of which is best, which is second best, and so on.

"This has been made possible by abandoning the 'ranking' or 'place' method of adjudication in favor of the now widely used rating plan, adopted by the National School Band Association some years ago."

Bands participating in the Florida State Contest are classified according to the total enrollment of the school represented and the age of the band. Adjudication against a standard, as determined by competent judges, in each class, determines the accomplishment of the organization or the individual.

Depending upon the rating received in each division of competition, bands are placed in one of three divisions, 1st, 2nd or 3rd. In addition, the judges, on each of their adjudication sheets for each band or individual competing, will make constructive criticism and helpful suggestions for improvement.

Bands placing in first division, in each class, in the State Contest are eligible for competition in the regional contests of the National School Band Association.




This is the second year of Class A standing for the Miami Jackson Band. Andrew Jackson, which has been a senior high school for only eight years, has risen rapidly in a musical way.

MRS. G. C. BYRD, Director

The Pasco High School Band of Dade City was organized in 1940, with 30 members. At present, the membership is 41. For the past four years the band has been under

the direction of Mrs. G. G. Byrd.

Although this is the first year in which this band has entered a contest, it has always been very active in furnishing entertainment for school and civic affairs in Dade City and Pasco County. For the past four years it has been a major attraction at all home and out-of-town football games.

Daytona Beach Mainland High School Band

WILLIAM J. BENTON, Director

Organized in 1938 under the direction of William P. Heney and entered the Florida Competition Festivals in 1939 in Class D. The Mainland High School Band has not taken part in the state activities since 1940 because of the war. Bandmaster R. L. Moehlman was the director last year and the band is now under the direction of Bandmaster William J. Benton.

De Land High School Band

JOHN J. HENEY, Director

At the present time the De Land High School Band Department has 114 members. A military system, used throughout the organization, makes possible the operation of a student government among members of the band, the young people themselves handling many of their problems

of discipline.

The De Land Band's history dates back to August, 1936, when it was first organized by Bandmaster John J. Heney. When the spring of 1937 arrived the band was entered in the annual Florida Bandmasters Contest at Palm Beach in Class B. The fifty youngsters earned Division One rating in all three types of competition. From that point benefits made possible the sending of the band to National Regional competition in June, 1937, at Rock Hill, S. C.

When school opened in 1940, the new \$20,000 band wing of the school was ready for use. It is of sound-proof tsructure with individual practice rooms and a shell for mass practice.

The De Land Band is one of the most active in the State, participating in the football games at home and out-of-town; the City Merchant's Christmas Parade; Central Florida Exposition Fair, Orlando; Gasparilla Parade, Tampa; concert tours; giving an annual home concert; playing for the tourist clubs and Sunday afternoon concerts as well as serving soloists and ensembles for civic meetings and many other requests.

The De Land High School is a Class B school. In 1939 the De Land Band entered Class A and remained in that class until competitive events ended with the war. The band was inactive during the war years and did not stand

inspection.

Delray Beach High School Band

RAY DEMARIS, Director

The Delray Beach High School band consisted of about one third of the present personnel in 1945, mostly beginners. At this time Ray DeMaris was engaged as director. Eighty percent of the band membership is made up of students below the tenth grade. The band has been quite active this year, playing at all the football games, numerous parades and concerts, and for the Easter Sunrise Services.

Ray DeMaris, Director, B.S.M., Drake Univeristy. Graduate work at University of Southern California. Before coming to Delray Beach he taught Instrumental Music for sixteen years in the Public Schols of Birmingham, Alabama, two and a half years at Birmingham-Southern College, and one year in the Public Schools of Fullerton, California.

Fort Lauderdale High School Band

HARRY F. McCOMB, Director

Harry McComb has been director of the Fort Lauderdale High School Band for the past nine years. He was born in Detroit, Michigan, and majored in music at Cass Technical High School in that city. As the recipient of a four-year music scholarship he attended the University of Miami's band and symphony. In April of 1938, before his graduation from the University in June, he took over the Fort Lauderdale Band and has been its director since that time. For the past two years he has attended the summer sessions at the University of Michigan where he is working on his Master's degree.

The Fort Lauderdale High School Band, which has consistently attained First Division ratings at national and state music festivals, is an integral part of Fort Lauderdale's

school and community life.

Besides providing music and entertainment at football games the Band plays for school assemblies and other school events. The dance band section plays for "Hit Parade" assemblies and for school dances.

For the community the Band provides music for parades, patriotic events, and the Easter sunrise services. It also plays a series of ten park concerts, sponsored by the city, for the winter visitors, and participates in the Orange Bowl Festivities.

Fort Pierce High School Band

MAJOR J. B. O'NEAL, Director

The Fort Pierce High School Band which has consistently rated First Division in State and National Festivals is a very prominent part of Fort Pierce's school and community life. The Band plays regularly at all of the football games, school assemblies and other school activities. It appears regularly during the winter season as an attraction for visitors and home folks. It plays an important part in the Easter Sunrise Service each year, and until the war participated in the Orange Bowl festivities.

Major J. B. O'Neal has been Director of the Fort Pierce High School Band since 1938. He was born in Troy, Alabama, and has been associated with some of the best concert bands and orchestras in the South. He has done extensive study at Conn National School of Music and Vandercook School of Music in Chicago. He was for four summers a member of the faculty at the University of North Carolina and for the past four summers has been

associated with Davidson College.

Gainesville High School Band

BARDWELL M. DONALDSON, Director

Like most schools Gainesville had a band before the war but because of the war lost its director and was was without a band during the school years of 1944-1945 and 1945-1946. In September, 1946, Bardwell M. Donaldson became the full-time director of the Gainesville High School Band. The band started the school year with 12 students who had played before. Vigorous invitations rounded up 45 beginners, and thus the beginning of the new band. It was, however, November before rehearsals because of the shortage of instruments. At State Contest time the band will have been in existence for six months.

Bardwell M. Donaldson, director, received his Bachelor of Music Degree from Stetson University in 1941. During 1941-1942 he was director of Titusville High School Band; 1942-1945 he spent three years in U. S. Navy. He played solo Clarinet during that time with the U.S.S. Essex Band. He played two seasons with the Central Florida Symphony Orchestra as First Bassoonist, also five seasons with the Daytona Beach Municipal Band and four years with the Stetson University Band and Symphony Orchestra in the same capacity.

Andrew Jackson H. S. Band (Jax)

M. B. WEARY, Director

The band was reorganized in September, 1945, under its present director and that year played for all Jackson football games including one out-of-town game and the annual Kiwanis Club Charity game. It also appeared in several parades and civic affairs and wound up the season with quite a successful spring concert.

As a result of the Summer Band School held during June and July the Jackson Band, proudly wearing the new uniforms furnished by the Andrew Jackson Dads Club, opened the football season of the current year with a fifty per cent increase in personnel. During the first half of this year, the band had made twenty appearances, includ-

ing all home football games, one out-of-town game, two non-school games, the Annual Kiwanis Club game, the New Years Day Gator Bowl game, and several parades and civic affairs as well as school pep meetings. The band was associated with the State Program for the first time this year upon entering the Fifth District Festival in St. Augustine the 14th of March, where it made first division in Class D.

Mr. Weary, the director, was born in Chicago, Illinois, June 22, 1902, and commenced the study of violin at the age of six, under his father, an accomplished musician and singer. At the age of eight, he began the study of piano at the Chicago Musical College and at the age of 10 progressed to the study of pipe organ. While attending Oak Park, Illinois, High School, he took up the study of 'cello and French Horn. While attending the University of Illinois he played 'cello in the University Orchestra and took up the study of Bassoon and was admitted, during his Freshman year, to the famous University of Illinois Band ,under Dr. A. A. Harding. Upon leaving the University, he played Bassoon in the Chicago Civic Orchestra, under Dr. Frederick Stock and the Chicago Band under William Weil, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra under Rudolph Ganz, and enlisted in the U.S. Marine Band, Washington, D. C., in June of 1924, where he served as Bassoonist in the Band and the White House Orchestra until November, 1932.

While in the Marine Band, Mr. Weary took up the study of clarinet and saxophone and, upon discharge, migrated to the west coast where he played in the San Diego and San Francisco Symphony Orchestras as well as numerous bands and dance orchestras and radio studio orchestras. During the war, Mr. Weary served as an instructor in the Fleet School of Music in San Diego and at the Naval Air Station at Jacksonville, Florida. Following his discharge from the Navy in 1945, he was appointed to his present position at Andrew Jackson High School, Jacksonville, and also received an appointment as a member of the faculty at the Jacksonville College of Music where he is a teacher of Woodwinds.

Jasper High School Band

ALBERT I. CINA, Director

The Jasper High School Band began organizing in 1939 under the direction of Wendell Waters.

In 1943 Miss Frances Alderman assumed leadership of the band until May 1944 and on September 1st of the same year the present leader, Albert I. Cina, began his duties. The Jasper H. S. Band for several years under the direction of Albert I. Cina, has been a worthwhile addition to the Jasper school and community life, playing at all school and civic functions. The band played in Valdosta, Ga., last April for the turpentine convention. The band has placed in first division in its class since its organization, in both playing and drilling.


Albert I. Cina is a native born Italian, descendant of a muscal family. At the age of sixteen he was solo cornetist and assistant director of *La banda di Sicilia* under the direction of his cousin Antonino Cina, famous maestro and



of the first World War Cina left America to fight for his native land, returning to his adopted country at its close. From 1924-27 he was cornetist and assistant director with Grella and his Scarlet Guards band at Tarpon Springs and Clearwater, Fla., also cornetist with famous Creatore's Band. Cina has been teaching school bands since 1928, ten years in Tennessee and about eight years in Florida. He has attended the bandmaster's summer school of music at Tallahassee F.S.C.W. for the past four summers.

Robert E. Lee H. S. Band (Jax)

ROBERT SMITH, Director

The Robert E. Lee High School Band of Jacksonville, Florida, was re-organized in 1945-46 after the war years and is now in its second year. Thanks to the help of it's P.T.A. and Dad's Club, the band has now been equipped with uniforms and instruments and its playing strength has increased to 50. This year the band is under the direction of Mr. Robert Smith, M.C., L.R.A.M. The band has never participated before in the State Festival and makes its debut at Miami.

Robert Smith, M.C., L.R.A.M., was appointed Head of the Music Department and Band Director at Robert E. Lee High School in September, 1946; also Band Director at John Gorrie Junior High School.

He came over to the United States from Scotland in June, 1946, where he received all his musical education and training at Paisley School of Music, The Scottish National Academy of Music, the Royal Academy of Music, London, and St. Andrews University, Scotland, where he was a Carnegie Scholarship student.

At the age of 12 he played with an orchestra on the radio; at 16, Smith was directing and conducting his first chorus.

He studied conducting and orchestration with John Barbirolli, formerly of the New York Symphony Orchestra, and Sir Hugh S. Roberton.

In 1939 Smith volunteered and joined the British Army as a private, and, after serving overseas in Egypt, Tunisia, Sicily and Italy, was finally discharged in February, 1946, with the rank of Captain.

Having been married in Italy to a Jacksonville lady, who was an officer in the American forces and whom he met in Tunisia in 1943, Smith decided to come and live in the United States and resume his musical profession.

Melbourne High School Band

DOROTHY PARKER, Director

The Melbourne High School Band participated in National and State Contests 1938-41, and was consistently awarded a First Division rating. From 1941-45 the band was at a standstill, and dropped in enrollment from 90 pieces to 7. The band is now in second year of reorganization by Miss Parker and is entering the competition this year for the first time since its reorganization, as a class "C" band.

The director, Dorothy L. Parker, is a graduate of the University of Illinois . She taught in Missouri, and was a member of the Missouri State Board of Music; director of instrumental Music in Shelby, N. C.; secretary of North

Carolina Bandmasters Association; dean of Girls and Instructor of Music at Transylvania Music Camp, Brevard, North Carolina.

Memorial and Cherokee Junior High Schools CLARENCE W. RUMPF, Director

When Edward J. Heney became the first director of the Orlando High School Band in July, 1939, some provision was made for instruction in instrumental music in the Memorial and Chokee Junior High Schools. The more advanced pupils in these two schools met with the high school organization on one or two afternoons each week.

Harry Parker came into the school system in August, 1940, and continued the work of Mr. Heney. The two junior high school bands developed into more independent organizations with some provision still being made for more advanced students to play with the high school group.

Ernest Pechin followed Harry Parker in 1944 and continued with a similar program. Both of these men endeavored to give about a third of their school day to each of the three bands, with some time alloted to after-school work with elementary groups.

In September 1945 Clarence W. Rumpf became director of the junior high school bands and the elementary groups, while Ernest Pechin devoted his time to the senior high school. Both the junior high school bands participate in assembly programs, parades, and concerts.

Clarence W. Rmpf, now serving his second year as director of the Cherokee and Memorial Junior High School Bands, hails from picturesque Bucks County in Pennsylvania. He received both his bachelor's and master's degrees at Temple University in Philadelphia, and studied privately under such well known teachers and musicians as George F. Boyle of Julliard School of Music, Ferdinand Paul of Sousa's Band and Henry Albert Lang, composer.

Mr. Rumpf came directly to Orlando after having spent some time as instrumental instructor at the P. S. du Pont High School in Wilmington, Del. Prior to that Mr. Rumpf directed bands in several Pennsylvania schools and was director of the Newton town band.

Now in his eleventh year of public school work Mr. Rumpf is looking forward to continuing his activities in Florida.

Ada Merritt Junior H. S. Band

JESSE BLUM, Bandmaster

The Ada Merritt Junior High School Band, organized by its present director, is now in its third year. The band entered its first competition in the Southern District Competition Festival at West Palm Beach last month and won a first division rating in concert playing.

The band gives concerts, plays at all assemblies and neighboring elementary schools; it took part in the Orange Bowl and Beach Fiesta Parades this year. The majorette corps was organized by Mrs. Dorothy Thomason, physical education instructor.

Twenty-three per cent of the student body of 450 are This band members of either the junior or senior bands. feeds into the Miami Senior High School Band.



Miami Edison High School Band

FRED McCALL, Director

The Miami Edison High School Band was organized in 1931. It is now composed of 90 members for concert and 130 members for marching. The current official ratings of the band are Division 1 in Class A for State and National competition in both concert and marching. The Edison Band has always been an active participant in all types of civic and educational programs throughout the state.

Miami Andrew Jackson H. S. Band

STEFAN JONES, Director

This is the second year of Class A standing for the Miami Jackson Band. Andrew Jackson, which has been a senior high school for only eight years, has risen rapidly in a musical way.

In September, 1944, Stefan Jones formerly of Columbus, Ohio, schools, took over the direction of the band and introduced a new style of musical shows in Miami. His band introduced swing and novelties of various sorts in parades and at football games in the Orange Bowl.

Mr. Jones is a graduate of Ohio State University. He received his early training at Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, Teachers College Columbia University, and Chicago. He is a member of Phi Mu Alpha, Sinfonia.

Miami Senior High School Band

AL WRIGHT, Director

Made up of one hundred and twenty student musicians from Miami Senior High School this Band has been a colorful feature at football games in Miami for the past several years. In addition to putting on half-time shows at its own school games, this band has also appeared at the Orange Bowl Games each year, several University of Miami games, and has put on a special Christmas spectacle for the Shrine game.

The Miami Senior High School Band has pioneered many "firsts" in half-time shows for Miami football fans. In 1939 they introduced the art of Swiss Flag Swinging. In 1940 their Black Light Show received nation-wide attention. 1941 brought on Miami's first large Majorette Corps when the Miami High Majorettes took the field. 1943 introduced Miami's first between-halves musical pageant which Miami High called "Salute to the United Nations."

The Miami High Concert and Marching Bands have consistently received first division ratings in State and National Contests in which they participate regularly.

Mr. Wright, Director of Music at Miami Senior High School for the past eight years is a graduate of the University of Miami. He is the President of the Florida Bandmasters Association and a past-president of the Florida Orchestra Directors Association.

Miami Senior H. S. Orchestra

AL G. WRIGHT, Director

During its many years of existence the Miami Senior High School Orchestra has consistently made the highest ratings in contest participation. Last year this group received a first division in the concert and sight reading events for Class A at the state contest.

The orchestra is often a colorful feature at school assemblies. In addition to this its members present concerts and participate in many civic and state events.

Made up of sixty members, this organization has its own student officers who work with members of the band council and the director.

Graduates from this orchestra readily find places in University symphonies over the country. Recently three were accepted into the symphony at Eastman School of Music. The University of Miami Symphony roster reveals a large number of Miami High School players on its list.

Ocala High School Band

LELAND M. ARMSTRONG, Director

The Ocala High School Band was organized in the winter of 1922 by Mrs. Browne Greaton Cole. At this time the Ocala High Band was the only school band in the State of Florida. It at that time boasted a membership of 14 young musicians. From this beginning Mrs. Cole worked hard and faithfully during the next years and by this hard work, developed the organization into a fine group of young musicians.

Mrs. Cole continued with her duties in Ocala until the Spring of 1944, when she retired from active duty. Mr. Leland H. Armstrong was chosen to head the music department beginning the winter of 1944, and is now director of the Ocala High School Band.

Mr. Armstrong is a native of Indiana, and during his own time in high school at Bedford, Indiana, organized the high school band there. He chose music as his profession and at the age of 19 began his professional work with Redpath Chautaqua as a member of Bohnmir Kryl's Band. He also played with the following bands: Thavin's Band; A. Libaratti's Band; Frederick N. Innes Band, and many of lesser name. He has worked in theatre orchestras and at one time was a member of the orchestra traveling with the silent film "The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse." He studied with Leslie E. Peck of the Metropolitan Music School; Indiana University; Cincinnatti Conservatory of Music, and Stetson University. He began teaching music, as supervisor of music in the public schools of Bedford, Indiana, which position he resigned in 1944 to accept the offer of Ocala as music director of the schools.

The Ocala band is composed of 60 young musicians with a governing student body elected officers as Captain, 1st Lieutenant (one), 2nd Lieutenant (four), and they appoint lesser officers, to have a smooth working organization. They came to Miami by virtue of the "clean sweep" in 1st Division in the 4th District Band Contest held at De Land on March 7th.

About the Bands . .

Orlando Senior High School Band

ROBERT R. McEMBER, Director

The Orlando High School Band was organized the latter part of July, 1939, under the direction of Edward J. Heney. From a beginning of about 25 students the instrumental department has grown to one of the largest in the state. In August, 1940, Mr. Heney was succeeded by Harry L. Parker as Director of Bands. James Mulholland was appointed Assistant Director. The department grew and expanded under Mr. Parker and continued to maintain the fine record started by Mr. Heney. During the war, Mr. Parker received a call to help in war work, so Mr. Ernest F. Pechin came to the rescue of the organization and carried on the work of the group in an able manner. Many eager young students learned much band music under the capable baton of this loved professional musician. Mr. Pechin passed away in the fall of 1946.

The present Director, Robert R. McEmber, came to Orlando in the fall of 1946. Now on inactive status from the Air Force, he intends to devote his time to the furthering of band music in Orlando. The band has had an active year thus far. In the fall, the Football Band gave eleven Football Shows during the half-time, and participated in eleven Civic and out-of-town parades. During the present concert season, the Concert Band has given thirteen con-

certs to date.

Pahokee High School Band

ROBERT O. LAMPI, Director

The Pahokee High School Band was reorganized May 10, 1940 and placed under the direction of R. O. Lampi. Rehearsals were continued through the summer and the Band was ready to perform for the football season of 1940. Since then the Band has performed, playing and marching, during every football season at home games and away from home. In the Contest Festival held in St. Petersburg in 1941, Pahokee entered as a Class D Band. It won 1st division in marching, 3rd in concert and sightreading.

During the War years the Pahokee Band won 1st division ratings in both Concert and Sightreading at the Wartime Inspections in Class C. Last year, the Pahokee Band won 1st division ratings in Concert, Sightreading and Marching at the State Contest held in St. Petersburg in

The Pahokee Band has taken an active part in school and civic activities. It has presented concerts during the winter and spring in Pahokee and also in Flagler Park in West Palm Beach. Having hurdled the obstacles of the District Contest, the Pahokee Band will be trying to maintain its high standard of achievement at the State Contest.

Robert O. Lampi was born in Mohawk, Michigan. He started the study of piano at the age of 12. He attended Northern Michigan College of Education at Marquette, Mich., where he majored in music, graduating with a B.S. degree. Upon first coming to Florida he taught music at Gulf High School, New Port Richey for three years. In the spring of 1940, he reorganized the Pahokee High School Band with which organization he has been ever since. Palm Beach High School Band

HOWARD SWYERS, Director

The High School Band was reorganized in 1944 by Howard B. Swyers, who was engaged as Director of Instrumental Music. He began with a small group, most of whom were beginners, and, from this nucleus has developed the present band. The band shows the results of his careful training, both in musicianship and marching. Mr. Swyers has also set up a Junior High School program, which is expected to be a source of well trained personnel in the future. It is hoped that the next step toward improvement can be made in the instrumentation of the band.

Plant City High School Band

CLARENCE JASMAGY, Director

The 60-piece Plant City High School Band, a comparatively young band but one of the most active in Florida, has progressed rapidly in the past few years. Besides the many school activities, chapel programs, community activities, football games, etc., the band gives a series of concerts at the City Park bandstand each season, sponsored by various Plant City civic organizations. Two years ago, the community raised \$2,000 for new band uniforms.

The director, Mr. Clarence Jasmagy, is a graduate in Health Education and Music, with B.S. and M.A. degrees from New York University. He also graduated from the Savage School for Health Education, New York City, and has taken work in Music at Columbia University. He is

now studying for his Doctor's degree.


Sarasota High School Band

The Sarasota High School Band was organized in 1929 by V. D. Sturgis, its present director. Starting with a membership of 28 it grew rapidly and for the past ten years has had a roster of from 65 to 80 members. This year it has its full Class B quota of 80 players. It has its own building on the school campus, containing the large rehearsal room with elevated seating, Director's office, practice and storage rooms, all accoustically treated. Through its director it was a charter member band of F.B.A. and has never missed a Contest or Inspection. It plays at all football games, both at home and away, school functions, and local events when needed and called upon. It has made one trip to the Orange Bowl and plays for all major Civic Festivals on Florida's West Coast. Its longest trip was to the 1941 Regional in Richmond, Virginia. others, studied with T. A. Bellamy, Charles Liebman and Luigi Von Kunitz, also at Freeport Conservatory. Entered the professional field in 1912. Wide experience in theatre and Lyceum work around Chicago and throughout the South and Middle West. First directing in theatres and with road units of D. W. Griffith's "Birth of a Nation" and "Hearts of the World" pictures. Director of Sarasota Municipal Band. Organized Sarasota High School Band in 1929. Still directs this organization. Charter member and past President of the Florida Bandmasters' Association.

St. Augustine Ketterlinus High School Band

H. M. KING, Director

On January 2, 1946, Director H. M. King called the first rehearsal of the newly organized School Band. Under his patient and capable leadership the band progressed rapidly and in April, the 60-piece unit traveled to St. Petersburg to participate in the State Band Festival where they won a First Division in Class D.

This year, at the age of 14 months, the band was awarded First Division Playing, Sight Reading, and Marching in Class B at the 5th District Festival held in St. Augustine on March 14th. Needless to say the Ancient City is proud of the accomplishments of this organization.

Sebring High School Band

P. J. GUSTAT, Director

The Sebring High School band is a pioneer in the field of instrumental music in the Florida Schools. Twenty-one years of progress is claimed because the band has been one of the cultural attractions of Sebring, both in and out of schools. It has made the highest ratings at all the state festival contests. The band responds to all requests for the adornment of assembly programs and other school activities. It is also one of the winter attractions during the tourist season, playing Sunday concerts at the municipal pier band shell from January 1st to April 1st. P. J. Gustat is the director.

Mr. Gustat does not boast about the band's record. He is content with the knowledge that for 20 years it has been among the state's leaders. Based on high school enrollment, 168, the band should compete in Class C. In 1928, the band moved up to Class A with the bands of the larger schools in the state.

The most distinguished graduate of the band was Major Thomas B. McGuire, AAF ace, who was awarded the Congressional Medal Posthumously. He was killed in the Pacific January, 1945, when he went to the aid of a fellow pilot.

Stuart High School Band

WENDELL D. WATERS, Director

The Stuart High School Band was organized in the summer of 1938 by James W. Crowley, who was then director of bands in Melbourne and Vero Beach. Mr.

Crowley was engaged for this work by a committee of Stuart citizens headed by Rev. T. C. Osteen and Mr. H. A. Wycoff. The band took part in its first contest in 1939 at West Palm Beach where it received two Third and one First Division.

The following year Bernard Coker joined Mr. Crowley as director, and the band appeared at football games, in concerts and at the Miami festival. During the third year the membership reached 60, in addition to the 20-piece junior band.

During the war Mr. Coker was called away and Mr. Wycoff became general manager. The band attended the Orange Bowl game in 1942.

Later directors were Frances Alderman in 1942; Harold Casterton in 1943, under whose direction the band took two First Divisions in home judging; and Rosario Cataldo in 1945. Then came a short interlude in which the band was without a director for a few weeks until Mr. Waters took over. During that time Mr. Otto J. Matousek volunteered his services and kept the band from becoming disorganized.

The band is supported solely by the Stuart School Band Association.

Wendell D. Waters, the present director, was born in Worcester, Massachusetts, in 1918, and came with his parents—also musicians—to New Port Richey, Florida, four years later. At the age of ten he began the study of 'cello and trombone under Marguerite and Gilbert Stansell. In 1939 he received a B.S. degree in chemistry from the University of Tampa, having been an active member of the University band, orchestra, chorus and string trio for five years.

In 1940 he formally organized the Jasper High School Band, which took First Division in Class D the following year at Tallahassee. After three years in Jasper he joined the Naval Reserve and spent a year and a half as communications officer on an LST in the South Pacific area. He took over his present position at Stuart on February 4th, 1946, while on terminal leave. Under his direction the band took First Division in all events at the District 2 Festival at Sebring.

Winter Haven Senior H. S. Band

ROY WOOD, Director

The Winter Haven Band is entering its seventh year of existence. It has grown to its present strength of seventyfive pieces in a well balanced, completely equipped concert and marching organization. In order to maintain and improve the calibre of the band, there is in the school system a sixty-five piece Junior High band and a beginners class of twenty, as well as fifty students in one of the elementary schools. The band makes seventy-five to one hundred public appearances a year. They carry on a concert series in the schools and in the community, where they are enthusiastically received. They also make many appearances locally and in other cities in fairs, pageants and other activities. It has been a consistent First Division winner in State band contests and has always supported the Florida Bandmasters' Association ideals in a well-rounded musical education program. The band is well supported financially by the Winter Haven community.






