HENRY FILLMORE

Head Judge

FLORIDA BAND AND
ORCHESTRA CONTEST

It has been said that wherever men march to the music of bands; in street parades, in the armed forces, or on the gridirons of America—the martial music of Henry Fillmore, with its compelling rhythm and melodic flair, sets the standards for all to follow.

One of the most prolific contemporary composers of American band music, Henry Fillmore is recognized today throughout the nation as the contemporary "March King." And his fame does not rest solely upon the march form of composition; for Fillmore is also the father of the Trombone smear. His "Shoutin' Liza

Trombone," "Lassus Trombone," and the other fourteen members of the trombone family have many imitators but few equals.

The whole range of band literature is Mr. Fillmore's forte. His catalogue of more than three hundred numbers in active use today includes overtures, operatic selections, solos, novelty pieces, songs, and student training material.

One of the most phenomenal phases of Fillmore's composing activities is that of the vast amount of easy material he has written for young bands. Under the nom-de-plume of Harold Bennett, he has written a series of four "Bennett Band Books," copies of which may be found wherever there is a school band anywhere in the world. Actually more than a million Bennett Band Books have been purchased by aspiring band students.

Henry Fillmore is much in demand as a guest conductor for band concerts and for clinical work with all-state bands and similar groups. Recently he was a featured guest conductor with Paul Lavalle's "Band of America" over NBC. His recent guest appearances include the University of Michigan Band, the Texas All-State High School Clinic Band, the University of Miami Band, the University of Pittsburgh Band, the Goldman Band, the University of Miami Band (Fla.) and the Chattanooga All-City Band. His appearances as guest conductor of the massed bands at the annual Orange Bowl Game in Miami are a highlight of the New Year's festivities.

Henry Fillmore's activities as a band and solo contest adjudicator are nationally recognized. He has served as a contest judge in many states including Utah, Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Mississippi, Georgia and for many years has acted in the capacity of head judge for the Florida Band and Orchestra Contest. His comments on the judging sheets are to the point, kind, and hopeful and tend to spur the competitor on to greater achievement rather than create a feeling of failure.

Henry Fillmore's professional experience includes both playing (trombone) and conducting in circus, road shows, vaudeville, stage shows, musical comedy, park bands, and radio bands. As conductor of the "Fillmore Band," he reached the height of his career as a professional musician. With this group he toured North America for a number of years and played to audiences numbering thousands. Fillmore was a pioneer in radio. He served as a band conductor for over fifteen years on radio station WLW (Cincinnati) starting when radio was in its infancy in 1922.

Many will be surprised to know that Henry Fillmore is also Harold Bennett, Will Huff, Al Hayes and Harry Hartley, these being the several pen names under which he writes.

CAPT. JAMES C. HARPER

Capt. James C. Harper, Band Director, Lenoir High School, Lenoir, North Carolina.

Graduate of Davidson College, Davidson, N. C. and received his M. A. Degree from University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, N. C.

Postgraduate study at Columbia University, New York, N. Y., at the National Music Camp, Interlochen, Michigan, Duke University, Durham, N. C. and others.

Received commission as Captain in the Infantry during World War I and served with the 81st Division, and later with various college S. A. T. C. Units, including that of Washington & Lee University, Lexington, Va.

After positions in New York and in Winston-Salem, N. C., returned to his home city of Lenoir, N. C. and directed the American Legion Band of the Dysart-Kendall Post No. 29, of the American Legion.

When the Legion Post donated a set of band instruments to the Lenoir High School and suggested the organization of a high school band, he was appointed Band Director of the new band and has remained with it for the twenty nine years which have followed.

The Lenoir High School Band grew from a beginning of some thirty players to its present status where there is a band in the Lenoir High School of about 90 players, one a little smaller in the Negro high school, two bands of about 80 players each in Junior High School, and special classes in band instruments which are preparing players for these bands.

James C. Harper has served on the Board of Directors of the National School Band Association, the National Board of Control of the Band-Orchestra Chorus Association, the North Carolina Bandmasters' Association, the North Carolina Music Educators Association and others. He is a Past President of the North Carolina Bandmasters' Association and a Past Secretary of Region 8 of the National School Music Contest Association.


The Lenoir High School Band has played for the Inauguration of the last six Governors of North Carolina, and has been playing for the annual Virginia-Carolina football game between the universities of Virginia and North Carolina ever since 1927, alternating between Charlottesville, Virginia and Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

It took part in all the Regional Contests in Region 8 (The territory from Maryland to Florida (Inclusive)) except one, and has been playing in the North Carolina State High School Music Contests since 1926 except on those years when it was ineligible to compete on account of too many previous wins. For the past 19 years in succession it has received a rating of Superior in the stiffest classification in the North Carolina State Contests, and has never received a rating of less than Superior in the marching contest in North Carolina.



MARK H. HINDSLEY

Since Mr. Hindsley became director of the band at Indiana University in 1925 he rapidly rose to a position of eminence in the band field and music education. After outstanding high school bands at Cleveland Heights, Ohio, he was chosen assistant director to A. A. Harding at the University of Illinois. During the war he was Music Officer of the Air Force Training Command and band and orchestra conductor at Biarritz American University in France. Returning to Illinois he succeeded Dr. Harding upon the latter's retirement in 1948. Under his direction the Illinois Bands have continued their high position and standards.



HAROLD B. BACHMAN

Harold B. Bachman is completing his fifth year as Director of Bands at the University of Florida in Gainesville.

Many of the older Florida residents and winter visitors will remember him as the Director of Bachman's Million Dollar Band, an organization of professional musicians, which played for the entertainment of tourists in West Palm Beach and Tampa, during the winter seasons from 1921 to 1927 and toured extensively for ten years.

Subsequently Bachman became director of the Band at the University of Chicago, and editor and advisor on school band materials with the Education Music Bureau of Chicago. He has long been active in the development of the school band movement. He has acted as an adjudicator at many State, Regional and National Band







Contests, and was for many years Chairman of the Sight Reading Committee of the National School Band Association.

In 1942 Bachman, who had been an Army band leader in World War I, returned to active duty. Among other assignments he was supervisor of Army musical activities in the South Pacific area and later Officer in Charge of the complete Special Services program during the operations at Bougainville and Okinawa. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel during the Okinawa campaign.

Bachman retired from active duty in the summer of 1948, to assume his present duties at the University of Florida. He has just completed a term as Chairman of the Southern Division of the College Band Directors National Association and is a Past President of the American Bandmasters Association.



DALE C. HARRIS


Mr. Harris' professional playing experience included concert tours with Conway's Band and Kryle's Band. He attended Simpson College in Iowa, receiving a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education and later continued his education at the University of Michigan where he received a Master's Degree in Music Education in 1937.

Mr. Harris was appointed Supervisor of Instrumental Music of the Public Schools of Pontiac, Michigan in 1927. Since that time the high standards of instruction in instrumental music on all levels of the educational program—elementary schools, junior high schools, and senior high school—have been substantiated by the record of the instrumental music groups over a long period of years.

In 1931 the Pontiac High School Band won its first state championship and is the only Class A high school band in Michigan to have received only First Division awards in state competition since 1931.

Mr. Harris is a member of several honorary organizations: The American Bandmasters' Association, The Bohemians Club of Detroit, Phi Delta Kappa Education Fraternity, Kappa Kappa Psi Band Fraternity, and Phi Mu Alpha Music Fraternity.

In addition to his duties in Pontiac, Mr. Harris has been one of the motivating forces in the school instrumental music program in Michigan, having been one of the organizers of the Southeastern Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association in 1933 and of the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association in 1934. He is a past president of both organizations.



DR. WILLIAM D. REVELLI

For more than twenty-five years, the name of William D. Revelli has been synonymous with the bands of America. His vision and ideals are responsible for the degree of perfection that the University of Michigan Bands have attained. His insistence upon quality of performance and his constant search for new and better band music, have earned for him the reputation as one of the country's leading conductors.


In the five years preceding his appointment at the University of Michigan, Dr. Revelli achieved the now-classic feat of five consecutive National Championships with the high school band of Hobart, Indiana. This accomplishment and the ensuing successes of the Michigan bands exemplify the vision and ideals of Dr. Revelli. Under his guidance, the Wind Instrument Department of the University has grown from a faculty of one in 1935 to today's staff of thirteen. The Band Department itself has been enlarged from a band of ninety-six members to three bands with a combined membership exceeding two hundred and fifty.

Recognized as one of the truly outstanding figures in the concert band world, Dr. Revelli has appeared as guest conductor in nearly every state in the nation. One of the top adjudicators in the field, Dr. Revelli's comments are always analytical, keen, and concise.

Dr. Revelli's uncompromising standards of musicianship, coupled with a boundless energy, have left their mark on all students who have been in contact with him, from the bright-eyed grammar school student to the most mature college musician.

Dr. Revelli's musical training reflects his driving determination and his high ideals. He has studied with such outstanding men of music as Leon Sametini, L. V. Saar, Charles Spadoni, Felix Borowski, H. A. Vandercook, and George Dasch. In 1915 he entered the Beethoven Music Conservatory, at St. Louis, and in 1919 continued his education at the Columbia Music School. He has also studied at the Chicago Musical College and at the Vandercook School of Music. In 1925 he was appointed music supervisor in the public schools in Hobart, Indiana, where he organized the instrumental department of that city, and developed it into national championship caliber within a few years.

Upon his appointment at the University of Michigan in 1935, Dr. Revelli saw the need of an organization of college band directors such as the organization with which he had worked in his career at Hobart. In 1941 he proceeded to organize the College Band Directors National Association, and was elected president of this group.



In recognition of his outstanding work and reputation in the music world, the Chicago Musical College, in June, 1947, conferred upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Music.

In addition to his duties at Michigan, Dr. Revelli is currently president of the American Bandmasters Association; honorary National Grand President of Kappa Kappa Psi, honorary band fraternity; member of Alpha K. Lambda, Phi Mu Alpha, and a host of other musical societies. For the past thirteen years he served as an editor of "Etude," the music magazine, and was recently appointed to the editorial staff of the "Instrumentalist" magazine. He is the editor of the "University of Michigan Band Series," and was recently appointed an editor of the new "Band Guild of America Series."



L. BRUCE JONES

L. Bruce Jones is nationally known as a music educator and Director of the Louisiana State University Department of Music Education.

Well-known in his field as a writer, adjudicator, and executive officer in many national music organizations, Mr. Jones came to L. S. U. in 1945 from Little Rock, Arkansas, where he was director of the famous Little Rock High School Band.

In the seven years he has been at the University, the Concert Band has enjoyed a reputation that ranks it with the nation's outstanding collegiate organizations.

Mr. Jones began his career in Little Rock, Arkansas in 1928 when he went there as director of the high school band. A leader in Southern music circles from the first, he organized the Arkansas School Band Association and the Dixie School Band and Orchestra Association. He served as concertmaster of the Arkansas State Symphony three years before becoming its director for the 1942-43 season.

Mr. Jones has contributed to many music magazines, served as instructor in summer sessions in a number of schools and as a conductor in numerous clinics, music camps, and state and national meetings.

Active in many musical fraternities and scholastic organizations, he is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, the highest honor for band directors. Mr. Jones served for six years as president of the N. H. S. B. A. and was elected to the presidency of the College Band Directors National Association for the year 1950-52.



H. MERLE SMITH

H. Merle Smith is present National Commissioner, All American Drum Majors' Association. He won first place, Senior Boys Division, Chicagoland Music Festival.

Mr. Smith teaches baton twirling under name of Smith School of Baton Twirling; also co-owner and co-director of Smith-Walbridge Camps, Inc., Syracuse, Ind.

Organizer of Baton Club of Michigan, South Bend, Ind. On teaching faculty of Jordan College of Music, Indianapolis, Ind.

Besides own private teaching, has taught at several twirling clinics throughout the U.S.A. He is a member of V.F.W. Post No. 1167, South Bend, Indiana, and American Legion Post No. 223, Syracuse, Ind. Twirled and drum majored Mishawaka High School Band, V.F.W. No. 1167 Drum and Bugle Corps.

Drill Instructor, Junior Drum and Bugle Corps, American Legion Post No. 357, South Bend, Ind. Corps won state championship under his instructions. Drum Major, U. S. Naval Seabee Band and 141st Battalion during World War II.



PAUL YODER

Mr. Yoder is a graduate of the University of North Dakota and of Northwestern University. He taught public school music in Aurora, Ill. and Evansville, Ind. before devoting his full time to writing. For the past 20 years he has arranged music for publishers in the school band field, including several books of football band shows, musical comedy selections, novelties, popular songs and original overtures.

Some of his best known numbers for band are: "Dry Bones", "Joshua", "Rumbalita", "Mountain Majesty", "Youth of America" and a recent arrangement, "Vincent Youmans Fantasy". Nearly every high school and college band library contains some of his arrangements or original compositions.

He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association and attended the recent convention of that organization held in Florida from March 3-7. At the present time he is the Editor for the Neil A. Kjos Music Co. of Chicago.



MANLEY R. WHITCOMB

For almost two decades football fans across the nation have been in accord with at least the fact—Ohio State University always has the most outstanding marching band they have ever seen or heard.

This high standard has been maintained as a result of the various directors' ability to combine a broad knowledge of musical interpretation with a vivid imagination in creating pomp and display. No exception to this rule is the band's present top-man, Prof. Manley R. Whitcomb, who directed the marching band to its crowning success in the Rose Bowl, January 2, 1950.

He was born in 1913 at Mellen, Wisconsin and reared there and in Milwaukee. When only 21 years old he graduated from Northwestern University with the bachelor of music education degree. In that year, 1934, he also achieved the high honor of being elected president of the University band.

Prof. Whitcomb then came to Ohio State as a graduate assistant in music. In the summer of 1935 he returned to Northwestern to earn his master's degree and came back to Ohio State that fall as an instructor. He was advanced to assistant professor in 1939 and has held his present title since 1946.

Prof. Whitcomb has worked untiringly with the marching band and the concert band, of which he is also director. He is accredited with taking an important part in the development of Ohio State's extensive band program, initiated by Prof. Eugene J. Weigel, the present chairman of the music department. This program, with an enrollment of more than 300 students, includes the famous 120-piece all-brass marching band, the only one of its kind in the nation, an 80-piece symphonic band, an 80-piece

activities band and a 110-piece R. O. T. C. regimental band.

Prof. Whitcomb became conductor of the marching and concert bands and supervisor of band programs at Ohio State in 1939. He has held these positions continuously since that time, except for two years in the Army during World War II. He is widely known throughout Ohio as an adjudicator and guest conductor, has a national reputation as an authority on marching maneuvers and band drill, and has appeared as speaker and conductor in over twelve states.

He is a member of the American Bandmasters' Association, College Band Directors' National Association, Ohio Music Education Association and Phi Mu Alpha, Phi Kappa Lambda and Kappa Kappa Psi fraternities.

Prof. Whitcomb is married and resides in Columbus.

He is currently on leave from Ohio State to do graduate work at Columbia University.



JOSEPH E. SKORNICKA

Joseph Skornicka, B. A. Wisconsin State College, Milwaukee, M. A. Northwestern University, Member of A.B.A., ASCAP, a violinist, played professionally from the age of fourteen, and had a wide musical experience when he entered the Milwaukee State College. Upon graduation he was appointed Director of Music at the Milwaukee Vocational School, the largest school of its kind in the country.

In 1927 he was appointed Supervisor, Bands and Wind Instrument Instruction in the Milwaukee Public Schools, a position which he still holds now, except that his duties have been expanded to include orchestras and the string instruments.

In 1942 he entered the military service and returned to Milwaukee in 1946 with the rank of Major. During the war, he was commandant of the Band Training Center at Camp Crowder, Missouri, Director of Athletics and Recreation at the Headquarters of the 7th Service Command, and finally, Director of Special Services of the same command.

Since his return from the service, he has written many works for band and orchestra and has been active in conducting clinics and festivals all over the country.

He has about a hundred published compositions and books for instrumental study which are used extensively throughout this country and in many foreign countries as well.

At present, he is the conductor of the Milwaukee Civic Band and Assistant Conductor of the Milwaukee Civic Orchestra, as well as Supervisor of Instrumental Music Education in the Milwaukee Public Schools. He is also President of the North Central Music Educators Conference, and member of Board of Directors, American Bandmasters' Association.

The "Hurricane" Marching Band plays and performs on the field for all football games at home and away, and participates in numerous parades throughout Southwest Florida during the winter season.



STEPHEN W. YANETOVICH, *Director*



Cocoa High School band has been organized since September, 1947. The same problems all other bands have at the start existed here also: no uniforms, music, equipment, or trained musicians, etc. The growth has been steady and now there are 78 members with uniforms and instruments.

We participate in all school and community activities. The band is particularly proud of its academic standing. Over half of our members are on the honor roll every month. Band members predominate among the membership of the Beta Club and the Honor Society. We have no merit system—no roll is checked—but attendance is very seldom less than 100%.

Bob Roth, the director, served in the Air Forces as a B-17 and B-29 pilot and now holds the reserve commission of Captain in the U.S.A.F.R. He has attended summer schools for the past six years, earning an M. A. degree in biology and administration at Peabody College in Nashville. He was originally graduated from Lake Forest College. At present he is also the assistant principal at Cocoa High School.

Kenneth Dooley, the assistant director, did his undergraduate work in music at Butler. Before coming to Cocoa, he taught for two years in Indiana where his bands were awarded "excellent" ratings.

At the state contest held in Tampa in 1952, the Cocoa High School band received two "superior ratings" and one "excellent." It has consistently been awarded "superior" ratings at the district band festivals.

Before World War II, the Seabreeze High School Band was skillfully conducted by Bill Heney. Mr. Heney has retired from the music profession.

The Seabreeze Band was reorganized in 1946 by Carl Hulbert. Since that time the band has entered the various district and state contests. The size and playing ability of the band has steadily increased, its present size being over 60.

Seabreeze band students are fortunate in being located within two blocks of famed Peabody Auditorium, the Oceanside Bandshell, not to mention the "World's Most Famous Beach." The band is invited to play on many more occasions than they are able to accept.

The Seabreeze Band Association, a group composed of parents and interested citizens, back the band and its director in a most helpful manner. A skillfully constructed constitution and by-laws help maintain the harmonious atmosphere enjoyed by the band members and its director.

Mr. Moeller came to Seabreeze in 1952. From a sound fundamental beginning under the late P. J. Gustat, Mr. Moeller entered Stetson University, playing first oboe in both the band and orchestra. Formal education was interrupted by a tour of duty with the U. S. Navy. After graduation from the U. S. Navy School of Music in Washington, D. C., Mr. Moeller served for 19 months as first oboe with the U. S. Navy Academy Band at Annapolis, Maryland. At the close of his enlistment, Mr. Moeller was invited to join the famed U. S. Navy Band in Washington, D. C., by Commander Charles Brendler. The moment to choose whether to be a professional musician or to continue training for teaching young people was at hand.

Mr. Moeller received his Bachelor of Music degree

from Stetson University in 1950. Graduate work was interrupted to accept the position as director of band and orchestra at North Fulton High School (Class "A"), Atlanta, Georgia.

William J. Benton, the director of the Mainland Band, is a graduate of Mercer University of Macon, and holds bachelor of arts and master of arts degrees from that institution. He has served as Chairman of District 4 of the Florida Bandmasters Association, Vice President of the Florida Orchestra Association, and is now President of the Florida Orchestra Association.

The Mainland Band is very active in its own community and is much in demand for parades and concerts in the eastern and central parts of Florida. It participated in the 1951 State Contest in St. Petersburg and the 1952 State Contest in Tampa last year. It is composed of both senior and junior high school students and is competing in Class BB.

CORAL GABLES SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA

Prior to entering the public school music teaching field, Mr. Cremaschi played in and directed professional orchestras and bands. He received his bachelor of science and master of arts degrees from New York University.

In 1945 he took up his duties as Director of Music at Ponce de Leon High School in Coral Gables and moved over to Coral Gables Senior High School in 1950.

Mr. Cremaschi has held numerous committee offices in state music organizations. Among others—secretary of Florida Orchestra Association, 1950-51; president of Florida Orchestra Association, 1951-52; and chairman District 1, Florida Bandmasters Association, 1951-52.

Quoting Mr. Cremaschi, "There are many factors that contribute toward a successful instrumental music department in a large modern high school. We in Coral Gables in addition to having a splendid student body to work with, enjoy the wholehearted cooperation of a wonderful Band Patrons Association. RAY DeMARIS, *Director*





The Fort Lauderdale High School Band, directed by Harry F. McComb does for its school and community what any good school band should do: entertains the football fans with snappy, costumed half-time shows, provides stirring music for parades, participates in programs of civic and industrial nature, entertains the student body at school assemblies, and presents more serious concerts for music lovers.

During the past year the concert band, the marching band, the majorette corps, the dance orchestra and solo and ensemble groups have provided a total of 125 musical programs for the school and community.

Running concurrently with these activities is a continuous and progressive program of musical education and advancement for each of the band members. Evidence of the uniformly high degree of musical proficiency obtained by Fort Lauderdale High band students is to be found in the number of college and school of music scholarships awarded to "Flying 'L'" band graduates.

Since 1938 the Fort Lauderdale High School Band has consistently received top ratings in district and state contests.

Band director, Harry F. McComb, holds an A. B. degree in music education from the University of Miami and a M. A. degree in school administration, guidance, and supervision from the University of Michigan. He is a Kiwanian, past-president of the Florida Bandmasters Association, member of University of Miami Summer Band Camp faculty, member of the American Bandmasters Association, and president-elect of the Florida Music Educators Association.

SOUTH BROWARD HIGH SCHOOL BAND

(Hollywood)

DAVID W. SHEPPARD, *Director*



The South Broward High School Band was organized by the Rotary Club in 1947 as a group for under-privileged children. In 1949 it became affiliated with the school system and is now considered one of South Broward's outstanding organizations.

In 1952 a feeder program was organized in the elementary grades and the High School Musicians were separated into two groups—Junior and Senior Bands.

The Band Patrons Association, which is active in guiding and financing the Band, purchased new uniforms for the Senior Band in December of 1951.

The Broward Band and Majorettes participate in the usual school activities; civic programs and parades; and presents a series of concerts each year at the New Band Shell in Hollywood.

This year, for the first time, the Band and Majorette Corps (along with one French Horn Solo) entered the district contest and were awarded First Divisions in all phases.

David W. Sheppard, Director of the South Broward Band, received his A. B. Degree at Erskine College, and M. A. Degree at Columbia University, New York City. Two and a half years additional study was devoted to music and music education at Converse College.

Mr. Sheppard was awarded the honor of "Best Male Musician" at Erskine in 1939; directed his own dance band four years; played in college orchestras, bands and civic symphony for several years.

In State and District competitions, his groups and solos have averaged better than ninety per cent First division ratings; and in 1951, the Spartanburg High School Band, under his direction, was selected to replace the All-State Band at the State Teachers Meeting.

Mr. Sheppard left his position as Senior Music Director in the Spartanburg City Schools to take over the South Broward High School Band in September, 1951.

The Haines City High School Band, under the direction of Mr. A. L. Rine for the seventh year, has become a prominent part of the school and community life of Haines City. It plays at all the football games, gives a series of concerts during the football season, goes as an organization or sends various members to entertain the tourists and club groups, and plays an important part at the

Easter Sunrise Service. The band appeared at the District Contest and the State Contest in 1952, and was awarded a final rating of "Superior" at both appearances.

Mr. A. L. Rine, the director, is a four year graduate of the University of Tampa. He has studied also at the University of Florida and Florida State University. He was band director in Sumter County prior to coming to Haines City.

ANDREW JACKSON SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL BAND (Jacksonville)

The Andrew Jackson Band was organized in September, 1945 under the direction of the late Milton B. Weary, and since that time has performed for all home football games and several out of town games. It has also appeared in numerous parades, civic affairs, radio broadcasts, and each year participates in the annual Kiwanis Charity game and the New Years Day Gator Bowl Game.

The band was first associated with the State program by appearing at the District Contest in St. Augustine, March 1947, and at the State Festival in Miami the same year. It has entered the contest each year since that time.

The Jackson band department initiated a new educational program for its band members at the beginning of the '52-'53 term by inaugurating a complete and full sophomore band with majorettes as a complete and separate unit in parades, concert, at football games, and appearing in district contest as a class A Band. The Senior Band is composed of juniors and seniors with a few outstanding sophomores to round out the instrumentation. This band is in class AA.

Philip B. Speer, director of the Jackson Bands, graduated from Mansfield State Teachers College, Mansfield, Pennsylvania in 1940 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education, and taught in the public schools in Pennsylvania before serving in the Air Corps. He is now in the process of earning his Master degree from F. S. U. at Tallahassee, Fla.

Mr. Speer accepted the position of bandmaster at Kirby-Smith Junior High School in Jacksonville in December, 1947 and remained in that position until January, 1952, at which time he accepted the position of bandmaster at Andrew Jackson High School.

LAKE WORTH HIGH SCHOOL BAND

JOE LUSK, *Director*



The Lake Worth High School Band under the direction of Mr. Joe Lusk is the pride of the community. Annually the band presents a series of concerts for the City and cooperates with civic and patriotic groups for special programs. The Trojan Band also participates in a full schedule of activities throughout the year. At football games both at home and away they present attractive and

entertaining shows. For a number of years the band has played for the Orange Bowl Parade, as well as the Fiesta del Sol and the Gladiola Festival.

Their dancing majorettes have attracted considerable attention with their half-time presentations and their tricky parade maneuvers. Twelve in number, the girls can do anything from military marching to boogie-woogie.

This year the band is one of the first in the state to add a complete section of Altoniums and Tromboniums to the Marching Unit.

A program has been undertaken by the Board of Edu-

cation to improve housing facilities of the band. Already acoustical treatment for ceiling and walls has been completed and permanent platform risers have been installed in the band room. Plans call for building of practice rooms and additional storage space.

Through the efforts of Mr. Lusk and the cooperation of the school administration and the community, in five years, the band has grown from thirty pieces to a concert band of seventy and a marching unit of eighty-four. For the last two years the band entered State Competition and received Superior rating on concert, marching, and sight reading.

Joe Lusk, the director of the Lake Worth High School Band, assumed that position five years ago. He is a graduate of Marshall College, where he received his A.B. and M.A. degrees. He played in the percussion section of the College Symphony and the concert band. Graduate work was done by him at the University of Michigan School of Music. For several years he was a member of the Huntington Symphony Orchestra.

Mr. Lusk is at present Chairman of District 1, Florida Bandmasters Association.

MIAMI EDISON SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL BAND

HARRY K. CARNEY, *Director*



The Miami Edison High School Band is twenty-two years old. Beginning in 1931, it was composed of eight members. Rehearsals were held after school under the direction of Mr. Fred W. McCall, Jr., now the director of the University of Miami Band. The growth of the Miami Edison High School Band parallels the growth of the high school band movement in the State of Florida.

The band first entered competition in 1934 at West Palm Beach. Its contest record over a period of twenty years is an enviable one. Few musical organizations can show a finer contest record.

The present uniform was established in the year 1938. This year, the entire concert band has been equipped with new uniforms. Each band member has two coats and three pairs of trousers.

The physical equipment of the band room is second to none. The new band building was built in 1950. The building consists of a large rehearsal hall, three practice studios, a director's office, storage room and a modern library. Several fine new instruments have recently been purchased. The instrumentation of the band includes a contra bass clarinet, celeste, alto flute and an english horn.

Two years ago Mr. Harry K. Carney became Director of Instrumental Music at Miami Edison High School. His previous experience included two years as bandmaster at Edison Junior High School, three years as Vocal Music Director at Miami Jackson High School, and nine years of teaching in the public schools of New York State. He received his college training at Ithaca College and Syracuse University.

Miami Edison High School is fortunate in having several fine junior high school bands in the surrounding area. Mr. Marvin Mocabee is bandmaster at Robert E. Lee Junior High School, Mr. Herbert Blin is bandmaster at Little River Junior High School, Mr. Robert Denk is bandmaster at Horace Mann Junior High School, and Mr. Joseph Caterino is bandmaster at Miami Edison Junior High School.

LANDON HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA

Jacksonville

JOSEF OSZUSCIK, *Director*



The present Landon Orchestra was re-organized by Mr. Oszuscik when he joined the school faculty last September 1952. The string program is now a part of the regular instrumental music program. Edwin T. Cook, band director was instrumental in making a preparatory survey of string players during the Spring term of 1952.

Prospects for the future of the Orchestra at Landon High School are very good since Jacksonville has a unique trust fund created by Mary L'Engle. This fund subsidizes the entire stringed instrument program in the schools by furnishing necessary instruments to students, music, and other necessary equipment needed in the development of orchestras.

Landon High School did not have an organized orchestra for a number of years. A State "first place" plaque rests in the school trophy case for the year 1937 indicating that at one time an orchestra existed.

Josef Oszuscik, director of Landon High School Orchestra, assumed this position in September, 1952. Prior to entering public school teaching he was clarinetist with the Indianapolis Symphony, the Chicago Civic Symphony, Gary (Ind.) Philharmonic, summer Concert Bands in the Chicago Area, and played many theater and radio engagements. Until 1937, he travelled extensively with musical organizations booking out of Chicago. His playing experience permitted him to play under the direction of many eminent conductors.

He received his under-graduate (B. M.) degree from Vandercook College of Music (Chicago) in 1939 majoring in instrumental music education, theory, and woodwind instruments, and minored in psychology, strings, brass and percussions. His Master of Music degree was earned at Northwestern University (Evanston) in 1949 majoring in music education and minoring in theory and clarinet. His additional college training was accomplished at DePauw University, Indiana University, Mississippi Southern College, and Univ. of Florida Extension.

He taught at Emerson High School, (Gary, Ind., 1935-39), woodwind clinician at Hardin-Simmons University (Abilene, Texas), and at West Texas State Teachers College, (Canyon, Texas), Director of Instrumental Music in Hattiesburg, Miss. public schools, (1939-48); Director of Music at Walton County High School in DeFuniak Springs, Florida (1948-52). While in Hattiesburg, Miss., he also taught at Miss. Southern College.

Participating actively in his profession, he is a Life Member of M. E. N. C.—serving three times on national MENC committees—(Patriotic Music, 1944-46); (Contemporary Music, 1946-49); and (Music Education in

the Community, presently). Chairman of State Contemporary Music Committee. He is a member of American Musicological Society, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, a member of Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra, a contributor of articles to various professional magazines, and is listed in "Who Is Who In Music".

While in Mississippi, he served as President of the M. B. A. and M. M. E. A. leaving the position of 1st Vice President of M. M. E. A. and the state licensing board of music examiners when he moved to Florida in 1948.

KATHLEEN HIGH SCHOOL BAND

THOMAS MUNAFO, *Director*



Located eight miles northwest of Lakeland, the community of Kathleen is proud of the progress made by their High School Band. In less than two years the Kathleen Band has increased its membership from 22 to 45 pieces. Some of the parades it has participated in during the past year are: The Lakeland Jaycee Rodeo Parade, Miss America Welcome Home Parade and the Santa Claus

Bowl Parade. Besides playing for all the half-time football shows during the football season, the Band furnished half-time shows for the Santa Claus Bowl games during the Christmas vacation. This year the Kathleen High School Band went to their first district III contest.

Mr. Munafo, a graduate of Florida Southern has been at Kathleen for three school years. Prior to that he taught privately and after his discharge from the service, played with several name orchestras including Shep Field. During his stay at Ft. Knox, Kentucky, the Kathleen Band director played with the Tankers Band, and arranged programs broadcast from the post over WHAS in Louisville.

OSCEOLA HIGH SCHOOL BAND

Kissimmee

The Osceola High School band of Kissimmee, Florida, was organized in January, 1937, under the direction of Miss Myrtila F. Beals who, in 1951, retired from the school system after 37 years of faithful service to her school in Kissimmee. Under Miss Beals' guidance, the band has performed at numerous functions and activities. The band usually numbers from 50 to 60 each year and is one of the prides of Kissimmee. When Miss Beals retired, Bud Campbell, a graduate of Florida Southern College and Northwestern University, came to Osceola High to assume the directorship of the band. The "Kowboy" band has recently added western type uniforms to its organization to conform with Kissimmee which is known as the "Cow Capitol of Florida." This was made possible by the energetic Junior Chamber of Commerce. The band has met its obligation to the community by parades, school activities, concerts and is invited each year to participate at the Tangerine Bowl festivities in Orlando. The band members themselves are active in school affairs and have themselves drawn up their own constitution for the band.

The Columbia High School Band was organized in 1936 under the direction of Carl Roberts.

In 1945, '46 and '47 the band was under leadership of Bernard Black. In 1947-48 and '49, Mr. Hubert assumed leadership of the band and on July 1st, 1949, the present director, Albert I. Cina, began his duties. Mr. Cina organized a junior band of 42 pieces from fourth up to eighth grade pupils.

The Columbia High School Band, under the direction of Albert I. Cina, has been a worth-while addition to the Lake City school and community life, playing at all school and civic functions.

Albert I. Cina is a native-born Italian, descendant of a musical family. At the age of 16 he was solo trombonist of La Banda di Sicilia, under the direction of his cousin, Antonio Cina, famous maestro and composer.

Cina came to this country in 1914, appearing on the concert stage with Seven Castelluccis. He was cornetist and assistant director with Grella and his Scarlet Guards band. Also cornetist with famous Creatore's Band and James Victor Concert Band. He has attended the bandmaster's summer school of music at Florida State University, Tallahassee, for four summers. Albert I. Cina is the composer and publisher of Gator Bowl March.

He came to Florida in 1939 as director of the Malone High School Band. With Jasper High School Band. Director of Valdosta (Ga.) High School Band 1947-49, and on July 1st, 1949, began his present tenure in Lake City.

The Columbia High School Band participated in Gator Growl Centennial Festivities in Gainesville, Fla., and also participated in the Band Day at Florida State University in Tallahassee.


Mr. Cina attended Summer School of Music six summers at the Florida State University.

MIAMI JACKSON HIGH SCHOOL BAND

STEFAN JONES, *Director*



The Miami Jackson Band is nationally known as one of the most widely travelled high school Bands in the country.

In July of 1949, the Band travelled to New York City to participate in the Lions International Convention Marching Contest. They won first place and a purse of five hundred dollars.

The Band has been a guest of the Cuban Government four times within the last five years.

The Band also has made two trips to the Dominican Republic as guests of the City of Ciudad Trujillo.

The Jackson Band was the first high school band in the country to stage the half-time extravaganza in the

Chicago All-Star football game at Soldier Field, August 15, 1952.

The Jackson Band staged the first four musical half-time shows for the Miami Mahi Shrine North-South College All-Star football game.

The Jackson Baton Ballet and Flying Twirlers accompanied Director Stefan Jones to San Antonio, Texas to give a demonstration with the Texas All-State High School Band at Lackland Air Field on August of 1951.

These trips have been made at no cost to the Band student or members of the Baton Ballet and Flying Twirlers.

Stefan Jones—A. B.; B. Sc. Mus. Ed.; Ohio State University. Member of Beta Gamma Chapter (Columbia University) of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, National Honorary music fraternity.

Mr. Jones assumed direction of the Jackson Band in September, 1944. He originated and introduced the Dancing Majorettes (now known under the copyright name of Baton Ballet), and has pioneered in featuring swing and dancing on the gridiron and on parade.

He has served as clinician for the Texas Bandmasters Association, and at the Mid-West Band Clinic in Chicago, and has taught at the Vandercook College of Music in Chicago.

LAKE WALES HIGH SCHOOL BAND

O. J. KRAUSHAAR, *Director*



The Lake Wales High School Band was organized in 1938 with Harry Grant, Jr., director. Mr. Kraushaar came to Lake Wales in 1941. The band plays an important part in school and community affairs, playing for the various athletic events, concerts, pageants, parades, as well as out-of-town activities. This year the members of the band did all of the ushering for the Passion Play performances

in the new Amphitheater. On March 4, the Highlander Band was hosts to the American Bandmasters Association, playing a concert in the evening under the direction of members of the Association.

All of the various Lake Wales High School units are known as the Highlanders thus the band name "The Highlander Band". To further carry out the theme a Scotch Unit has been added to the band. There are nineteen in the unit: Six dancers, Six pipers, Six drummers, and the Major. This unit works separately as well as with the band. The MacLeod Clan tartan is the official dress worn by the unit. The band has its own building which is cared for completely by the band members.

Otto Kraushaar, Director of Music in the Lake Wales Schools, is a graduate of Howe Military School, Howe, Indiana, having been a full scholarship student by playing bassoon and saxophone in the band and orchestra. In 1917 he enlisted in the Navy and played in the band on the Flagship U. S. S. Pennsylvania under the direction of Victor J. Gabel. After the war he took post-graduate work at Howe School before joining the Canadian Kilties Band for one season. The following season he played with the Chicago Concert Band, going from Chicago to the LaGrange County, Indiana Public Schools where he was supervisor of instrumental music for seven years. During this time in LaGrange County he played bassoon in the Elkhart, Indiana, Ft. Wayne, Indiana, and Kalamazoo, Michigan symphony orchestras and was director of the LaGrange Citizens Band and the Metropolitan Band in Sturgis, Michigan. He then joined the Sousa Band and was bassoonist with the band for four years.

MIAMI EDISON SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA

ROBERT A. LAWRENCE, *Director*



The Miami Edison Senior High School Orchestra was established in 1921, meeting just two days each week under the supervision of a director from Miami Senior High School. In 1931, 10 years later, Mrs. Francis Deen, director of vocal work in the school, also became director of the orchestra. With the aid of a string teacher who came in from time to time to assist, she developed the orchestra.

During the years between 1944 and 1949 Mr. Fred McCall took over the direction and in 1950 it was under the direction of Hr. J. Howard Reynolds who was also the director of instrumental music that year.

In 1951 Mr. Robert A. Lawrence became the Associate Director of Instrumental Music and Director of Strings.

MIAMI SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL BAND

AL G. WRIGHT, *Director*



The Miami Senior High School "Million Dollar" Band directed by Al G. Wright has achieved an impressive record of activities and accomplishments during the past decade.

With its auxiliary organizations, the Miami High Band numbers around two hundred and ten students. Of the total, one hundred and fifty are bandsmen, the remaining students being members

of marching units—Majorettes, Twirlers, Swiss Flag Swingers, and United Nations Color Guard.

The Miami Senior High School Band has pioneered many firsts in half-time shows for Miami football fans. In 1939 they introduced the art of Swiss Flag Swinging. In 1940 their Black Light Show received nation-wide attention. 1941 brought on Miami's first large Majorette Corps when the Miami High Majorettes took the field. 1943 introduced Miami's first between-halves musical pageant which Miami High called "Salute to the United Nations." In 1948 the first gridiron "Ballet Corps" was introduced to football fans.

Hailed as one of the snappiest bands in the south for its marching maneuvers and throughout the country as a superb concert group it is dear to the hearts of Miamians as Miami's "Million Dollar" High School Band.

The Miami High Band has been selected by UNESCO to present a program for the International Music Festival in Brussels, Belgium, in July, 1953. This honor accorded the Band by the United Nations will do much to prove to the rest of the world the excellence of Florida High School Bands.

Al Wright is Director of Music at Miami Senior High School (Florida), a position he has held since 1938. He serves as bandmaster for the school's three bands and conductor for the Concert Orchestra as well as sponsor of the school dance band and the Etude Club, the instrumental music honor society.

He received his undergraduate (BA) degree from the University of Miami (Fla.) in 1937 with a major in Public School Music and received his Masters Degree in Education in 1947 with a major in School Supervision and Administration. Mr. Wright has served as guest conductor with a number of musical organizations including the University of Michigan Band, the University of Miami Band, University of Kansas Band, University of Florida Band, the East Tennessee High School Clinic Band, the Stetson University Chorus, and the Florida All-State High School Orchestra.

Mr. Wright is actively engaged in the promotion of music education as a profession as well as in the development of fine musical organizations at Miami Senior High School. Following terms of office as President of the Florida Bandmasters Association and as President of the Florida Orchestras Association, Wright is now President-elect of the Florida Music Educators Association. His other activities include; member of the Florida Teacher Education Advisory Council; member of the NSBOVA Board of Control, SMEC Division; SMEC Chairman of the School Music Rooms and Equipment Committee; Florida State Chairman MENC String Committee; State Chairman MENC School-Community Relations Committee; member board of advisors for the "Instrumentalist" Magazine.

He has served as an adjudicator in nearly all of Florida's six district Band, Orchestra, and solo contests.

MIAMI SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL ORCHESTRA (Stingaree)

Miami High's Stingaree Orchestra is the second orchestra of the school. It is directed by Gladys Ditsler and is composed of players who are preparing themselves for entrance into the Senior Orchestra.

This group make frequent appearances playing for the school assemblies, teas, dinners, and other formal social affairs.

Mrs. Ditsler was appointed to the position of String Teacher and associate director of the Miami High School Orchestra in February 1947. Since that time a very active growth and interest has become evident in string music at the school. She organized courses in Music Theory and Music Appreciation, both of which quickly became popular with the students.

Before coming to Miami High Mrs. Ditsler taught privately for over ten years—organized own trio and played professionally as violin soloist and also as a member of a number of music organizations. Concertmaster of Miami Concert Orchestra; Firestone Broadcasts under Howard Barlow; Miami Opera Orchestra, and University of Miami Symphony Orchestra, of which she is a charter member, playing with the symphony until 1947.

Mrs. Ditsler received B. M. Degree in Public School Music—magna cum laude from University of Miami. She studied violin with Dr. Arnold Volpe and Dr. Joel Belov—the former an artist pupil of Leopold Auer, the latter a pupil of Carl Flesch—Theory and Harmony with Dr. W. S. Sterling, formerly of Cincinnati Conservatory of Music.

She is also a member of Sigma Alpha Iota, national honorary music organization.

At present she is serving as Secretary-treasurer for the Florida Orchestra Association, a post she has held for three years. She is also a member of the Editorial Board of the FMEA publication "The School Director".

C. W. Rumpf, director of the Boone High School Band, is a native of Pennsylvania. He received both his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Temple University.



H. CARLTON MASON, *Director*



"Del" as he is better known, has taught bands, orchestras and glee clubs in Hillsborough High School for the past 20 years.

Mr. McDougale was succeeded by J. L. Littlefield who was called into the Armed Forces after the first few weeks of school. John K. Burton directed the band during the remainder of the 1951 fall semester.

John DeYoung became director of the band in January 1952. Mr. DeYoung is a graduate of Stetson University, where he received the degree of Bachelor of Music.

The band history is a record of progress covering eleven years of participation in school community and state events.

The Titusville Band was first organized in 1928 under the leadership of Frank Campbell. Jackson McDonald then took over the helm and is credited with developing the band into a fine organization. Throughout the years that followed the band had some successful and some lean years but did compete in the state contests of 1940 and 1941. Some of the other best remembered leaders were Miss Conquist, Bardwell Donaldson and Seth Miller.

The band now is a 60 piece organization and is rapidly developing instrumentally as well as musically. It has the whole hearted support of the community and is sparked by a live wire Band Parents Association. At present it is under the leadership of H. G. Shuler who is completing his third full year as director.

H. Gardner Shuler is a native of Seattle, Wash., where he had extensive theater, radio and symphony orchestra experience.

He obtained his bachelors and masters degrees in music education from Northwestern University. From 1928 to 1945 he taught band and orchestra in the junior and senior high schools of Hamtramck, Michigan—an island city in the center of Detroit. His groups competed regularly in state competition and were twice represented in national and national regional contests.

Mr. Shuler was Michigan School Orchestra representative to the National Regional Board in 1944-45 and a member of the Michigan String Planning Committee. He left the music teaching field temporarily upon coming to Florida but played in the Central Florida Symphony. In 1950 he took over the music activities of Titusville High School.

PALM BEACH HIGH SCHOOL BAND

In the Fall of 1937 the band movement was organized in the Palm Beach High School taking the name of its sponsor the local Junior Chamber of Commerce. The J. C. Band as it was known was under the direction of Frank Sturcio who developed outstanding organizations during his years as director.

When Mr. Sturcio resigned to enter the service the band was placed into the school curriculum and Mr. Lynden Street was employed as its director. In the Fall of 1944 Mr. Howard B. Swyers assumed the leadership of the Palm Beach High School Orchestra and Band.

The band now owns about \$25,000.00 worth of instruments, uniforms and equipment. This achievement being the result of the efforts of a splendid Band Patrons Association combined with the hard work of the band and its director. The music department now includes a 90-piece concert band, 50-piece orchestra, 45-piece junior band and a 50-piece beginners band. Mr. Swyers is at present the president of the Florida Bandmasters Association and with the exception has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the F. B. A. He has also served as president of the Florida Orchestra Association and was for four years the chairman of District I.

WINTER HAVEN HIGH SCHOOL BAND

The Winter Haven High School Band has been organized for thirteen years, and participates in Class "BB" in F. B. A. festivals. Winter Haven has one of the largest band programs in the State having three hundred students playing in one of five bands in Junior and Senior High School. The Concert band of ninety six pieces heads this group followed by the seventy two piece second

band. Then comes the Junior High Concert band and two beginners groups.

The Winter Haven band is well known over the State where it participates in such events as Gasparilla parade in Tampa, Festival of States in St. Petersburg, Citrus Exposition Parade in Winter Haven, and many others. The band has appeared as the invited guest of every bowl football game in Florida. They have appeared twice in the Miami Orange Bowl game and parades, and on one New Year's day had the distinction of sending the concert band to the Orange Bowl and the second band to the Cigar Bowl in Tampa. Last year the band was


