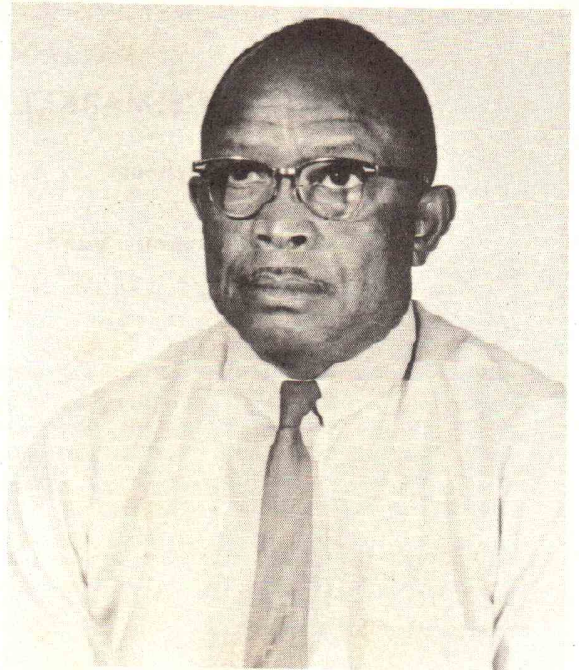

Band History

The Attucks High School Band was organized in February, 1953. The first six instruments of the band were received in January, 1953. These were purchased by the school. Later in February the County School Board appropriated funds for band instruments.

Thirty members were on the roster when the band made it's debut in May of the same year, playing the National Anthem and several marches. During the past school years the band has exhibited many colorful performances on halftime shows, during the football season and participated in six State Festivals, receiving Superior and Excellent awards in marching and concert. The band has also received trophies and awards in community festivities. The band has also made appearances on television. The band was organized by Mr. S. A. Ford, who was director until 1961, when Mr. Bertram C. Wilson, a graduate of Florida A. & M. University, Tallahassee, Florida, became director.

The rapid progress of the band is due to the wonderful cooperation of the principal, Mr. J. A. Ely, the faculty, student body and the most untiring efforts of the Band Parents Association. The present membership is 62.

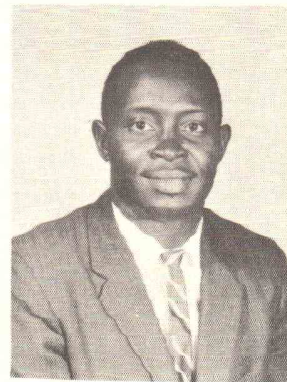

Band History

Because of an anxious desire to have instrumental music introduced into the curriculum of Jewett High School, the principal, Mr. Canary Robinson, secured the services of Mr. Neal D. Bland as bandmaster in September, 1951. Mr. Bland organized a drum and bugle corps which was the nucleus of the present school band organization.

During the school term 1952-53, the school band membership increased to twenty-eight. This was due partitively to the fact that a number of instruments had been donated to the school and that the school had purchased additional ones.

Under the directorship of Mrs. Monique Simpson, the band made commendable progress. It was during the school term 1952-53 that the band gave its first public concert and attended its first band clinic (as a spectator).

Mr. Johnny B. Neal became bandmaster in September, 1953, and under his energetic leadership, the band roster numbered forty-five during that school term. As a tribute to the fine spirit and achievements of the band, the citizens and school community combined their financial efforts and purchased uniforms for its members.

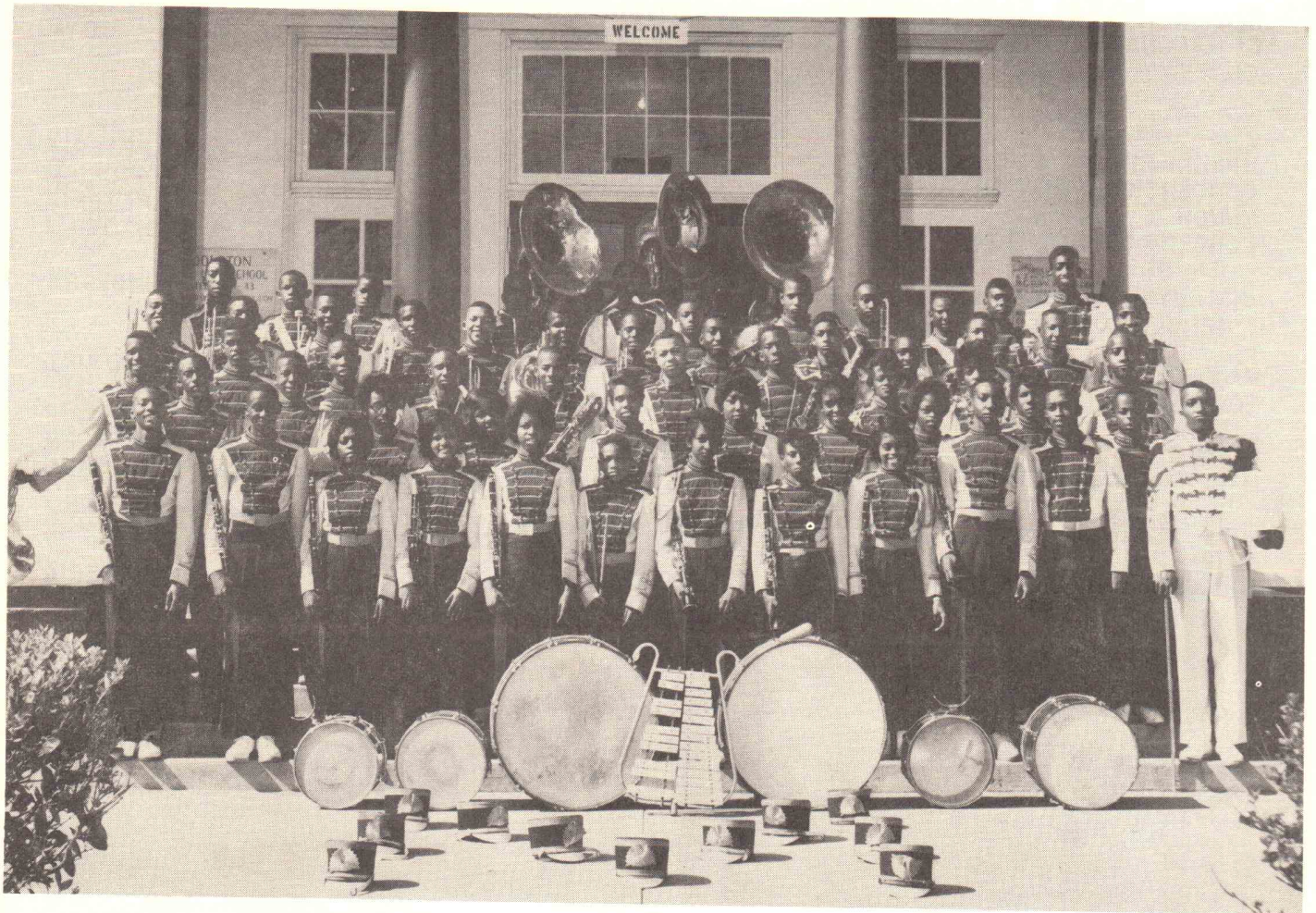

The Basis of School Band Competition

"The primary purpose of the school music competition is to serve as a factor in the educational program through the direct values, the inspiration, examples and incentives afforded the young people and their teachers and directors. Therefore, adjudication of participants should be regarded as a means for evaluating the progress and musical status of the group or the individual, rather than a mere comparison with other participants to secure an expert opinion of which is second best, and so on.

"This has been made possible by abandoning the 'ranking' or 'place' method of adjudication in favor of the now widely used rating plan, adopted by the National School Band Association some years ago."

Bands participating in the Florida State Festival are classified according to the total enrollment of the school represented and the age of the band. Adjudication against a standard, as determined by competent judges, in each class, determines the accomplishment of the organization or the individual.

Depending upon the rating received in each division of competition, bands are placed in one of five divisions: Superior, Excellent, Good, Average, or Below Average. In addition, the judges, on each of their adjudication sheets for each band or individual competing, will make construction criticism and helpful suggestions for improvement.

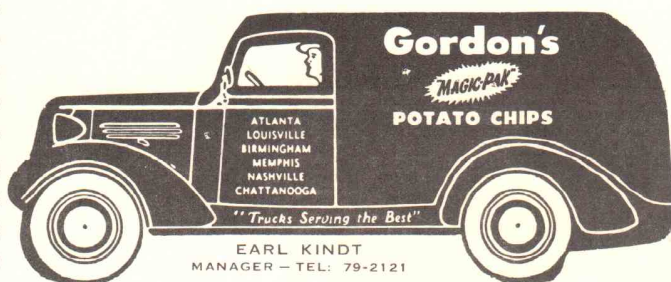

Band History

The Roosevelt Jr. - Sr. High School Band was started in 1948, when three of its faculty members, Mr. Roy Lee Caldwell, Mrs. L. B. Jackson, and Mrs. Catheryn Browne-Smith combined their musical knowledge for the purpose of organizing a band. The equipment then owned by the school was four instruments which had been purchased from a citizen of Lake Wales. During the term of 1949-50, Mr. A. L. Brodie, the principal, took over the band, and began to build. This term the band (12) pieces, played for its first football games. This growth necessitated an instructor. Mr. Howard of Atlanta, Georgia was secured for the position. Mr. Howard did a good job, but was hired the next year in Atlanta, Georgia. Mr. Thomas J. Simpson, Jr. of Tampa, Florida, was located in Chicago, Illinois where he had graduated from Chicago Musical College. After his arrival, the band began to grow by leaps and bounds. There was a continuous drive by him to make this band one of Florida's best. For the first time in 1953, the band entered in the District and State Festivals in Class "C". At the District Festival held in Sarasota, the band was awarded first division ratings in Marching and Concert performances. It was also awarded the same ratings at the State Festival held in Orlando, Florida. The band also received special commendations for being the best dressed band at the festival that year.

The school year of 1954-55, Mr. B. C. Pratt, Jr. became director of the band. He continued the successful work started by his predecessors. The band has continued to win first division in Marching and has never been below second division in Concert during his stay here. In 1957-58, we were successful in winning first division in Marching, Concert, and Sight-reading. We are now striving hard to get balance instrumentation and to get into the first division habit again.
