REPORT TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS: December 3, 2010

SUMMARY

- Handbook revision of auxiliary section is presented for your approval. This "re-write" is for clarification purposes only, with the exception of one recommended rule change explained below (related to timing).
- The Auxiliary Adjudication Training Manual (AATM) is provided today for your reference only (one per district). This document represents an attempt to align the auxiliary adjudicator training sessions with the content and rigor of the band sessions. Please do not duplicate. Prospective adjudicators should follow new procedure:
 - 1. Application with references

- 2. Auxiliary Adjudicator Training
- 4. Board approval

- Provided in page protectors are the following—to be provided to Auxiliary Adjudicator for use at each event: (available soon on the FBA website with other MPA forms)
 - Auxiliary Adjudicator Reminders for Solo & Ensemble MPA
 - Auxiliary Adjudicator Reminders for Marching MPA
 - o Auxiliary Grading Reference Sheet for ALL MPA events (backed up to each one)
- Adjudicator certification process has been reorganized and structured for effective and efficient
 training in an effort to add quality adjudicators to the adjudication list. Please make every effort
 to hire certified auxiliary adjudicators for your MPA events. A copy of the letter sent by US
 Mail and email to all current auxiliary adjudicators is provided.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Remove "routine must be at least 1:30 (one and one half) consecutive minutes of the 2 to 3 minute period" located in Handbook p. 23—III-H.4.e (Saber), 5.e (Rifle), 6.e (Flag) and revised version (p. 2 for Flag and Rifle, p. 3 for Sabre). Replace with "Performers must keep equipment in hand at all times except during release moves." **Rationale**—Solo choreography should focus (during the entire routine) on the chosen equipment.

2. Delete page 13 of the Adjudication Manual. **Rationale**—This page is connected to the previous adjudication sheets which were revised several years ago, making it obsolete.

PROPOSED REVISIONS OF FBA HANDBOOK AUXILIARY SECTION FOR 2011-2012

III - H. AUXILIARY SOLO AND ENSEMBLE EVENTS

A violation of rules may result in lowering of the rating, performing for comments only, or disqualification of the entry. Performers should be prepared to correct inspection infractions. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

1. STATE AUXILIARY MUSIC PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

- a. The State Auxiliary MPA is administered as part of the State Solo and Ensemble MPA for instrumental events and will be held in two or more regions of the state (contingent upon availability of facilities).
- b. Events will be evaluated by a panel of three adjudicators.

2. GENERAL INFORMATION

- a. Categories to be adjudicated at FBA Solo and Ensemble Music Performance Assessments include:
 - 1) SOLOS—BATON, DANCE, FLAG, RIFLE, SABRE
 - 2) ENSEMBLES—BATON TWIRLING, INDOOR GUARD, DANCE
- b. Ensembles must have a minimum of 4 performers. (No duets or trios are allowed.)
- c. Each performer must be a member of his/her school band program, either curricular or extra-curricular.
- d. A performer may be entered in a maximum of four (4) auxiliary events with the following limitations:
 - TWO (2) Solo events, provided that the equipment is different.
 - TWO (2) Ensemble events (Twirling, Guard, Dance)
 - The two ensembles must have different equipment
 - Dance ensembles must be from different genres, i.e. pom, jazz, kick, etc...

Note: A student may also perform an instrumental solo or ensemble as long as the overall limit of four (4) Solo & Ensemble events is observed.

- e. Music and lyrics need to be school-appropriate for auxiliary events.
- f. Attire and movements need to be school-appropriate for auxiliary events.
- g. No substitution may be made to replace a solo or ensemble which cancels its performance.
- h. At District MPA, a change in the <u>personnel</u> of an ensemble or the <u>number</u> of performers must be approved by the District Chairperson BEFORE the ensemble's scheduled performance time.
- i. At State MPA a change in the <u>personnel</u> of an ensemble or the <u>number</u> of performers must be approved by the Executive Director BEFORE the ensemble's scheduled performance time.
- j. Recording of adjudicator comments at District and State Music Performance Assessments is required for Auxiliary solo and ensembles. Recording materials will be provided for the adjudicator(s) by the sponsoring component.
- k. For District MPA events, the District Chairperson or the MPA host will appoint a volunteer(s) who will be responsible for the following:
 - 1) Inspecting all equipment, props, shoes, etc. being used or worn by the student performers
 - 2) Introducing the scheduled performances and running the sound system for performance music
 - 3) Assisting the adjudicator as needed
- The performance floor will be that of a standard basketball court. The gym area may not be used for warm-up during a performance.
- m. Flash photography may not be used during any performance.
- n. Directors (or any individuals) may record (video) only their respective groups' performance.
- o. All auxiliary events will be adjudicated using letter grades A, B, C, D, E (not numerical values).
- p. Refer to adjudicator comment sheets for other information concerning specific criteria to be adjudicated.

An event performing outside the minimum/maximum time limit will have its rating lowered one division.

3. BATON SOLO TWIRLING

a. MUSIC

Routine must be performed with music. A standard march (i.e. Sousa, Fillmore, etc.—not just any composition arranged for marching bands) is required. Music selection should be determined by the director.

b. TIME

1:45 - 3:00 (1 minute, 45 seconds - 3 minutes). One and one-half (1½) minutes of the routine must be <u>consecutive</u> single baton work. Timing starts with the first movement of the performance and stops with the logical conclusion of the performance.

c. ENTRANCE / EXIT

- 1) Entrance: Parade rest, attention, step off toward adjudicator, halt and salute
- 2) Exit: Performer must exit to the rear marching and return to the starting position.

d. EQUIPMENT

Performers may use 2 or 3 batons during the solo. NO other props/equipment may be used. Performers should keep one baton in hand throughout the performance (except for aerials).

- e. <u>CONTENT</u>
 - 1) Flashes, flips and legwork

4) Rolls

2) Vertical and horizontal aerials

5) Ambidexterity

3) Vertical and horizontal finger twirls

- 6) Variety of aerial catches
- f. <u>INSPECTION</u>—will take place in a specified area 30 minutes prior to the performance time.
 - 1) Shoes for indoor use only (tennis shoes, jazz shoes, jazz sneakers, ballet shoes, lyrical shoes, etc.) are required. No hard soled shoes are allowed.
 - 2) Wipe the soles of shoes before entry onto performance floor to remove any debris that may have been picked up en route to performance.
 - 3) Check all props (backdrops or scenery) for proper padding to protect the gym floor.
- g. <u>ADJUDICATION</u>

Each performer should check the adjudicator comment sheets for specific criteria to be adjudicated.

4. FLAG TWIRLING SOLO

a. MUSIC

Routine must be performed with music. Music selection should be determined by the director. Music and lyrics need to be school-appropriate.

b. TIME

1:45 - 3:00 (1 minute, 45 seconds – 3 minutes). One and one-half (1 ½) minutes of the routine must be consecutive flag work. Timing starts with the first movement of the performance and stops with the logical conclusion of the performance.

c. ENTRANCE / EXIT

The performance should include an organized entrance and exit, even though the entrance and exit will not be adjudicated.

I. EQUIPMENT

Flag pole minimum length required is five (5) feet. Flag (silk) minimum dimensions required are 27" x 44". Performers may not use rifle, sabre, or baton to augment their routines.

e. CONTENT

- 1) Spins
- 2) Tosses
- 3) Carving/Extensions
- 4) Hand to Hand Changes
- 5) Grip Changes
- 6) Work on Different Planes

- 7) Rolls and Wraps
- Work done on all areas of the equipment (top, middle and bottom)
- 9) Equipment Layered over body movement
- 10) Traveling (use of the performance floor)
- 11) Visual Musicality/Choreography
- INSPECTION—will take place in a specified area 30 minutes prior to the performance time.
 - 1) Shoes for indoor use only (tennis shoes, jazz shoes, jazz sneakers, ballet shoes, lyrical shoes, etc.) are required. No hard soled shoes are allowed.
 - 2) Wipe the soles of shoes before entry onto performance floor to remove any debris that may have been picked up en route to performance.
 - 3) Check all props (backdrops or scenery) and equipment for proper padding to protect the gym floor.
 - a) Flag poles must be cushioned with rubber tips which must be securely taped to the poles to prevent their coming off during the performance.
 - b) Tips that are badly worn will not meet the equipment standards.

g. <u>ADJUDICATION</u>

Each performer should check the adjudicator comment sheets for specific criteria to be adjudicated.

5. RIFLE TWIRLING SOLO

a. MUSIC

Routine must be performed with music. Music selection should be determined by the director. Music and lyrics need to be school-appropriate.

b. TIME

1:45 - 3:00 (1 minute, 45 seconds – 3 minutes). One and one-half (1 ½) minutes of the routine must be consecutive rifle work. Timing starts with the first movement of the performance and stops with the logical conclusion of the performance.

c. <u>ENTRANCE / EXIT</u>

The performance should include an organized entrance and exit, even though the entrance and exit will not be adjudicated.

d. EQUIPMENT

Rifles are defined as devices constructed so as to conform in outward appearance to military rifles with optional hardware. Performers may <u>not</u> use flag, sabre, or baton to augment their routines.

e. CONTENT

- 1) Spins
- 2) Tosses
- 3) Carving/Extensions
- 4) Hand to Hand Changes
- 5) Grip Changes
- 6) Work on Different Planes

- 7) Rolls and Wraps
- 8) Work done on all areas of the equipment (top, middle and bottom)
- 9) Equipment Layered over body movement
- 10) Traveling (use of the performance floor)
- 11) Visual Musicality/Choreography
- f. <u>INSPECTION</u>—will take place in a specified area 30 minutes prior to the performance time.
 - Shoes for indoor use only (tennis shoes, jazz shoes, jazz sneakers, ballet shoes, lyrical shoes, etc.) are required. No hard soled shoes are allowed.
 - Wipe the soles of shoes before entry onto performance floor to remove any debris that may have been picked up en route to performance.
 - 3) Check all props (backdrops or scenery) and equipment for proper padding to protect the gym floor.
 - a) Rifle butts and tips must be padded and taped to prevent damage to the floor.
 - b) All metal accessories must also be padded and taped.
 - c) Padding must be placed on any part of the equipment that could cause damage if dropped or intentionally hit on the floor.

g. ADJUDICATION

Each performer should check the adjudicator comment sheets for specific criteria to be adjudicated.

6. SABRE TWIRLING SOLO

a. MUSIC

Routine must be performed with music. Music selection should be determined by the director. Music and lyrics need to be school-appropriate.

b. <u>TIME</u>

1:45 - 3:00 (1 minute, 45 seconds – 3 minutes). One and one-half (1 ½) minutes of the routine must be consecutive flag work. Timing starts with the first movement of the performance and stops with the logical conclusion of the performance.

c. <u>ENTRANCE / EXIT</u>

The performance should include an organized entrance and exit, even though the entrance and exit will not be adjudicated.

d. **EQUIPMENT**

Sabres are defined as equipment designed to be held in the hand for cutting and defense, with either a curved or straight blade. Performers may <u>not</u> use rifle, flag, or baton to augment their routines.

e. CONTENT

- 1) Spins
- 2) Tosses
- 3) Carving/Extensions
- 4) Hand to Hand Changes
- 5) Grip Changes
- 6) Work on Different Planes

- 7) Rolls and Wraps
- 8) Work done on all areas of the equipment (top, middle and bottom)
- 9) Equipment Layered on top of movement
- 10) Traveling (use of the performance floor)
- 11) Visual Musicality/Choreography
- f. INSPECTION—will take place in a specified area 30 minutes prior to the performance time.
 - 1) Shoes for indoor use only (tennis shoes, jazz shoes, jazz sneakers, ballet shoes, lyrical shoes, etc.) are required. No hard soled shoes are allowed.
 - 2) Wipe the soles of shoes before entry onto performance floor to remove any debris that may have been picked up en route to performance.
 - 3) Check all props (backdrops or scenery) and equipment for proper padding to protect the gym floor.
 - a) Sabre tips must be padded and taped to prevent damage to the floor.
 - b) Hand guards and the top of the handle must also be padded and taped.
 - c) Padding must be placed on any part of the equipment that could cause damage if dropped or intentionally hit on the floor.

g. ADJUDICATION

Each performer should check the adjudicator comment sheets for specific criteria to be adjudicated.

7. DANCE SOLO

a. MUSIC

Routine must be performed with music. Music selection should be determined by the director. Music and lyrics need to be school-appropriate.

3:30 – 7:30 (3 minutes, 30 seconds – 7 minutes, 30 seconds). Timing starts with the first movement of the performance and stops with the logical conclusion of the performance.

d. ENTRANCE / EXIT

The performance should include an organized entrance and exit, even though the entrance and exit will not be adjudicated.

e. **EQUIPMENT**

- 1) FLAGS are defined as any material attached to a pike, pole, rod or staff other than an authorized weapon and used as a flag, with minimum size of 8" by 12". Flagpoles must be at least 24" in length.
- 2) RIFLES are defined as devices constructed so as to conform in outward appearance to military rifles with optional hardware. Simulated rifles must be at least 24" in length.
- 3) SABRES are defined as equipment designed to be held in the hand for cutting and defense, with either a curved or straight blade. Simulated sabres may be constructed of wood, plastic, metal or other suitable material and should include a hand guard. A cutting edge is not required. Simulated sabres/swords must be at least 24" in length.

III. MPA Online Project

- o FSMA Executive Committee will solicit input from FBA, FOA and FVA to cooperatively select the annual auditing firm.
- o FSMA will pay for annual audits of FBA, FVA, FOA and components will submit financial materials to FSMA by July 15 each year.
- o Full audit report will be presented to the FSMA Board in February.
- b. FSMA Dues will increase \$20 (across the board) next year to compensate for cost of all annual audits.

JUNIOR HIGH/MIDDLE SCHOOL REPORT - Linda Mann

Junior High/Middle School

Report to the Executive Board:

7 & 8 grade All State Honor Band

- There were 131 students from 131 schools in the honor band this year.
- All 21 Districts are represented in the ensemble.
- 223 forms were received this year.
- Only 13 forms not considered this year due to being filled out incorrectly, not a member, or missed postmark.
- 35 schools did not have a student placed in the band. They will receive first consideration next year providing they turn in a form correctly, on time, and they have paid their membership dues.

Concerns/Recommendations

Directors need to send more names on the forms and include color instruments. There was a large amount of forms with only one name. This limits possibilities for a school to have a

student in the ensemble. This continues to be a problem. Please encourage directors to list multiple students.

Directors are not precise when filling out the forms. They are using incorrect or incomplete mailing addresses for their schools. Additionally, no email addresses are included. This becomes a problem when sending the music and corresponding with the directors prior to convention.

There seemed to be confusion as to the process of having a student selected for the Honor Band. Please discuss this at your 4th meeting. Forms are submitted. They are checked for membership, correctness, postmark, and participant contracts. Once I receive the 7/8 auditioned band list, I pull those applications. From the remaining forms, I seat the band from what information is given about the students on the forms.
