Look and see if your school is listed. If not, get busy and send your Classification Blank in immediately, or check with your District Chairman.

Please read them carefully and thoroughly, so that you can come to the F.B.A. Clinic General Business Meeting on Thursday night, very well informed as to what is transpiring in F.B.A., and be able to vote intelligently on matters of utmost importance to you, your students, and the Band Program in the State of Florida.

If you have purchased the new 1977 Edition of the F.B.A. Official Music List, you will receive in the mail, in the next week or so, the New Annual 1979-1980 Supplement for Band free of charge. In order to receive the 1979-1980 Supplement, you must have purchased the New 1977 Revised Edition. The Edition is \$12.00 to F.B.A. members and \$15.00 to non-F.B.A. Members, payable in advance, and may be purchased from your State Secretary, Robert Lampi, Box 703, Pahokee, Fla. 33476.

REMEMBER --- the dates of the F.B.A. Clinic are January 10, 11, 12, 1980, --- the place is Tampa --- F.B.A. Headquarters will be the Riverside Hilton, on Ashley Street, just off I-275. The Junior High Band will rehearse at the Hawaiian Village. The December issue of the Music Director has a complete Clinic Schedule in the Center Fold, and we presume the January issue will also. Check this schedule for last minute changes that might have had to be made. Check the F.B.A. part of the schedule for details regarding Clinics, Rehearsals, Meetings, Times, Places, Etc. Your reservations should have been made by this time. Have all your students bring folding music stands. The percussion personnel must bring their own equipment and/or make some arrangements for the "Big Stuff". The Senior High Symphonic Band Members and the Junior High Concert Band Members need to have their uniforms, but no hats. Hope you have pre-registered for the Clinic -- it will save you much time in the registration line. Badges must be worn to all CLINIC EVENTS and the EXHIBIT AREA. Admission to these is by CLINIC BADGE ONLY. F.B.A. membership cards will be checked at the General Business meeting too.

Kirk; District 12 Chairman Idral Bowen; District 14 Chairman Kenneth Tolbert; Junior High Representative Bill Cannon and Executive Secretary Robert Lampi and his Secretary Ilinae Lampi. District 13 Chairman, Dennis Silkebakken was represented by Chuck Ulrey, who appeared late. District 5 Chairman Freddie McClain also came late. District 2 Chairman Grady Brackin and District 9 Chairman Ron Youmans were absent from the entire meeting. Guests and visitors for all or part of the meeting included Richard Neimeyer, District 1 Secretary and Chairman-Elect; Tom Bishop, Del Kieffner, Ed James, John Acosta, Paul Karasaw and President of F.M.E.A. Clanton made a motion, seconded by Tolbert, that the reading of the minutes of the Summer Convention General Business Meeting and the Past Presidents' Council meeting, both of August, 1979, be dispensed with. Passed U.

T A B L E D P R O P O S A L S

#1. June Minutes 1979, page 1, #1 at the bottom: "That the Executive Board raise the dues of the Association enough to hire a full-time Executive Director. Length of contract, salary, and expenses to be determined by the Board.

RATIONALE:

1. We need a full-time Executive figure to represent the philosophy and rules and regulation of the Florida Bandmasters' Association to the State at large, whenever, and wherever, needed.
2. The needs of our greatly enlarged Association demand far more resourcefulness, thought, and time than any President can deliver, if he is encumbered with Band Director position.

MECHANICS:

1. The office of President is to remain unchanged.
2. The office of Executive-Secretary is to remain unchanged.
3. The Executive-Director would be responsible to the elected President and

would be required at all times to represent accurately the philosophy, rules, and regulations of the Florida Bandmasters' Association. He is only to carry out the policies of the Board and the President. He is to be used for such functions as:

1. Gathering first hand information.
2. Administrrating research projects.
3. Organizing Clinics.
4. Representing F.B.A. to other groups and officials.
5. Lobbying.
6. Visiting District Meetings.
7. Clarifying misunderstandings of rules, etc.

Poll of the Districts was taken with at least four Districts not represented in the poll. Suggestion was made to hold off until all were present (which never happened). Some explanation was made that this was a projection for the future and not for the immediate present time. The President was instructed to appoint a Committee to make a study of this and report to the Board. A poll of the Districts was taken with only 2 not represented later on in the meeting and the result showed the PROPOSAL CARRIED.

#2. June Minutes 1979, page 11, Letter "O" at the bottom: "change the classifications as follows:

Class C	1	-	300	Play 2 Grade II's
Class CC	301	-	500	Play 1 Grade II, 1 Grade III
Class CCC	501	-	700	Play 2 Grade III's

"To implement the report as reported by Cassels with the numbers and classifications as reported."

This proposal was not acted upon by but one or two Districts because some claimed it was lost in the June Minutes and not with the regular tables proposals.

Steuart made a motion, seconded by Bowen, to table again for a poll until all the Districts had a chance to take a poll. Motion to table carried.

After some more discussion, Heinlen made a motion, seconded by Caudill, that this proposal #2, be brought up at the January General Meeting. PASSED U.

Bell made a motion, seconded by Steuart, that the same action be taken on Proposal #1. Scott made a motion seconded by Heinlen, to table the above motion. Motion to table DEFEATED. Vote taken on the original motion and it PASSED.

So both #1 and #2 Proposals will be taken up at the January General Business Meeting.



#2. Kirk made a motion, seconded by Scott, "that State Contest scheduling be by double classification on consecutive days."

Motion by Bell, seconded by Bowen, to TABLE TO THE DISTRICTS FOR DISCUSSION AND POLL. PASSED 7 to 5.

#3. Ulrey made a motion, seconded by Cannon, "that all All-State auditions for Symphonic Band scales be the same pattern of  - tongued up and slurred down - to include arpeggios for both Junior and Senior High in the pattern  -tongued up and slurred down."

Motion by Cannon, seconded by Agrella, to TABLE TO THE DISTRICTS FOR DISCUSSION AND POLL. PASSED.

- #4. Ulrey made a motion, seconded by Clanton, "that there be no smoking by Judges in the performance room during the performance of the Solo and Ensemble Contest on both District and State levels, that smoke breaks for Judges be scheduled within the performance times."

Motion by Herron, seconded by Agrella, to TABLE TO THE DISTRICTS FOR DISCUSSION AND POLL. PASSED U.

- #5. Bell made a motion, seconded by Steuart, "that F.B.A. return to one Judge for Stage Band for District and State".

Motion by Clanton, seconded by Caudill, to TABLE TO THE DISTRICTS FOR DISCUSSION AND POLL. PASSED U.

Motion by Scott, seconded by Bowen, to TABLE TO THE HANDBOOK COMMITTEE AND REPORT LATER. PASSED.

#### NEW PROPOSALS THAT PASSED

- #1. Scott made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that a spokesman from F.B.A. contact television networks concerning halftime shows of college games being shown on TV in their entirety. AMENDMENT: Have our state board contact other state boards to get a more unified effort. PASSED.
- #2. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Kirk, that each band director that enters more than one band at State Contest have the option of entering the band only with classification status, and not listed as a second or third in the judges sheet and/or program. PASSED U.
- #3. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that a statewide policy that all events, other than contest, we not accept late entries. PASSED.
- #4. Caudill made a motion, seconded by McClain, that the F.B.A. Board do what it can with F.H.S.A.A. about increasing the time limit on half-time shows and ask for an additional two minutes, making a 17 minute half-time. PASSED.
- #5. Cannon made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that All-State students play prepared material first, followed by scales and sightreading. PASSED.
- #6. Agrella made a motion, seconded by Bell, that F.B.A. explore the late \$50.00 fee problem, regarding the acquisition for said funds by the F.H.S.A.A. when the inconvenience of handling and processing the late paperwork is that of F.B.A. Also, that the F.H.S.A.A. account for the usage of all late fees from the F.B.A, over the past few years. PASSED.
- #7. Agrella made a motion, seconded by Bell, that F.B.A. Board request from F.H.S.A.A. a copy of this year's budget, last year's audit and any further books showing expenditures, savings and receipts. PASSED.

The President was instructed to appoint a Committee to study the fines problem and report to the Board.

- #8. Ulrey made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that for All-State Junior and Senior High Auditions rhythmic patterns and articulation patterns for scales be the same. PASSED U.

- #9. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Scott, that any item referred to Districts for poll be considered a vote of the general membership provided three-fourths of the Districts have made the poll. PASSED U.

- #10. Caudill made a motion, seconded by Herron, that the All-State Audition Application Forms be revised so that the Principal and Band Director only

have to sign the application one time for all the applicants. PASSED.

- #11. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Scott, that any business enacted by the Board in the May/June Meeting not take effect until the following year; unless it was passed by a District poll tabulated at that meeting, and to have the President appoint a Committee to up-date and improve Board organizational proceedings. PASSED.
- #12. Heinlen made a motion, seconded by Scott, that the Executive Secretary be authorized to purchase ten (10) Past-Presidents' lapel pins at the price quoted of \$26.10 each. PASSED U.
- #13. Scott made a motion, seconded by Bell, that the proposal of World Photos to take pictures at the State Contest be rejected. PASSED.

#### NEW PROPOSALS THAT FAILED

- #1. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that if a band enters two or more bands at State Contest the following year they may double the number of All-State try-outs they may enter. FAILED.
- #2. Bowen made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that F.B.A. hire all State Contest Judges from out of state. FAILED.
- #3. Tolbert made a motion, seconded by McClain, that Junior High Orchestra auditions (Wind players) be separated from F.B.A. All-State Auditions. FAILED.
- #4. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Scott, that any business enacted by the Board in the May/June meeting not take effect until the following year, unless it was voted by a District poll. To have President appoint a Committee to set up procedures for the Board to follow. FAILED.

A motion duly made by Herron and seconded by Clanton, to take the above motion to the Districts for discussion and poll failed, and the vote showed defeat even with a requested recount taken.

MOTION #11 from "MOTIONS PASSED" above SUPERCEDES this "MOTION FAILED" #4, since the one that passed was enacted AFTER the one that failed, even though they are almost identical.

#### NEW PROPOSALS that died for lack of a second

- #1. Motion by Scott, that the Executive Secretary should contact MENC whenever (informed by a member that) a member or person has paid F.B.A. dues through MENC. NO SECOND.
- #2. Motion by Agrella, that District X is for the concept of a full time F.B.A. Ex. Sec. Director if funding can be provided some way other than raising F.B.A. members dues. NO SECOND.
- #3. Motion by Agrella, that Godfrey and Miller will present specifications for the purpose of establishing a State Marching Contest to F.B.A. State Board Meeting this December. NO SECOND.

#### NEW PROPOSALS declared out of Order

- #1. Steuart made a motion, seconded by Clanton, that All-State sightreading music be printed. DECLARED OUT OF ORDER.
- #2. Two proposals from District 13 were declared out of order because they were made by a person who is not a paid-up member of F.B.A. and therefore not eligible to make a motion.

Adjudicators Committee report given by Chairman Ed James at this juncture of the meeting.

Motion by Stuart, seconded by McClain, that Dale E. Ludwig be added to the F.B.A. District Judges list, pending receipt of letters of Recommendation. PASSED U.

Chairman Ed James recommended the four (4) following to be added to the F.B.A. District Judges List:

Chairman James read names of judge aspirants who had not completed all the paper work that was necessary - Buggs, Borden, Morris, Bobby Adams, Collins, Sargeant, Holly, Shepherd, Temple, Hebson, Deering and Monzingo.

District VI had several questions and suggestions as follows:

1. Question of wording in Handbook.
2. Set-up Clinic on Non-Twirling Marching Ensemble for January.
3. What happened to the Redistricting Committee?

Much discussion ensued.

At exactly 4:00 P.M. the order of business was interrupted to pay tribute to our departed brother OTTO J. KRAUSHAAR, who died December 6, 1979. He was Past President of F.B.A., F.M.E.A., A.B.A. He joined F.B.A. in 1949 and was given Honorary membership in 1962. A moment of silent prayer was observed after which Secretary Lampi gave an extemporaneous eulogy and prayer in memory of our departed friend and brother, OTTO J. KRAUSHAAR. His funeral was being held in Miami at 4:00 P.M. this day.

Called attention to the MENC Convention to be held in Miami Beach next April - expected to be a fine convention - very finest groups will be performing - Florida people needed to be evaluators and hosts for Tuesday.

Florida breakfast scheduled for Friday, April 12.

All who attend the Convention are asked to attend the Florida Breakfast.

Dues must be paid to MENC and FMEA for Clinic attendance. There will be a strict Badge inspection with new Badges this year. Not fair for those who do not pay dues to partake of the Clinic. People need to be professional. FMEA should be very proud that we have a piece of legislation enacted last year - "Music is Basic".

A joint Component Groups Board Meeting will be held again this year, possibly May 23,24,25 - Need to look at structure and see what needs to be done. Set up a Blue Ribbon Committee - about 12 people who have been involved over the years and discuss growth, trends and give ideas - need for better communication among Music Educators, so that all people can be involved.

Gentlemen:

The Continuing Music Committee meet at Winter Park High School on November 29-30, 1979 for the purpose of up-dating the FBA Annual Music List. Committee members present included Jack Williams, Joe Courson, Bob Lampi, Bill Cannon, Ben Godfrey, Dr. Charles Johnson and Andre Arrouet. The Winter Park High School Band spent several sessions reading many of the titles that were up for consideration. Their diligent efforts were sincerely appreciated by all committee members.

The transistion to the new committee leadership has been smooth, largely due to Jack Williams helpful cooperation. In addition, the expertise exhibited by all committee members, new and old, enabled us to function with thoughtfulness and efficiency.

It should be pointed out that we are receiving fine cooperation from many of the publishers; however, there seem to be some that have not received our communications or possibly have elected to withhold their assistance in this effort. Steps are being taken to encourage these publishers to participate in subsequent years. We are also working to develop a philosophy that is consistent with the principles of music education and its relativity to the prrformance of quality music literature in all classifications.

The membership should be made aware of the following policies that concern the selection of FBA Contest Music:

1. The current Culmulative and Annual (1979-80) music lists are the official FBA Music lists. Any previous cumulative or annual list are invalid.
2. Requests for permission to perform titles not found on the current lists must be sent to me in quadruplicate prior to application for district or state contest.
3. Permission will not be granted for titles that were rejected by the committee at its annual meeting or titles that have been deleted from previous annual lists.

The committee would like to thank the board for granting us the opportunity to serve FBA in this capacity. Selection of new literature can at times be a frustrating experience; however, it has been a very rewarding one for us all.

Report of 1979 All Star Band Committee      Dec. 7, 1979

The 1979 22nd Annual All Star Marching Band presented pre-game and half-time shows at the Tampa Bay Bucs - Washington Redskins game held in the Tampa Stadium, on Aug. 4, 1979.

Head Clinician was Frank Wickes, Director of Bands at the University of Florida. Auxiliary Clinicians were: Steve Bucholtz, Percussion; Joan Kaywell, Flags; Shelley Segrest, Majorettes and David Hess, Drum Major.

The All Star Band Committee selected 256 students from the 501 names submitted by 70 High School Band Directors.

Communication with students and directors was handled by the University of South Florida Center for Continuing Education, Dick Brightwell, Director and Joan Sheppard, Secretary.

All details of the organization of the band, ie: housing, meals, practice fields, banquet, dormitory supervision etc. were arranged by Dick Brightwell in coordination with Jim Croft, Director of Bands at the University of South Florida.

Participation in the All Star Band cost each student \$105.00, which included housing, meals, registration and organizational expenses of operation by Continuing Education.

The expense of school buses to transport the band from U.S.F. to Tampa Stadium was paid by the F.B.A. (approx. \$400.00)

The cost of clinicians was paid by a \$2,000.00 donation from the Tampa Bay Bucs to the F.B.A.

The 22nd Annual All Star Band was a fine group of students; the music and show plan provided and taught by Frank Wickes was elaborate and enjoyable.

Plans are being made to hold next summer's All Star Band again at U.S.F. with performance at the Bucs game still to be finalized for the week of Aug. 4-9, 1980.

SUBJECT: 1979 Summer Convention

By all accounts the 1979 FBA Summer Convention was another in a series of successful meetings. The combined activities of the FBA All Star Marching Band, replete within Buc's NFL half-time show, and the Summer convention added a dimension unique to this meeting.

Highlighted were, of course, the marching band clinics, a pair of adjudication and instrument repair clinics, and sessions dealing with elementary band methodology and discipline, all preceded by a challenge address from an active administrator.

The additional free time left room for idea exchange, another hotly contested golf



tournament (dominated by Jerome Edwards) and the traditional "gemullicheit" that dominates this convention!

It is important to note, I think, that the format of this convention was predicated on suggestions given President Courson by those attending the 1978 meeting. Pres.-Elect DeYoung will be similarly guided by suggestions given him at the last 1979 session.

I think there is much to be said for the combined format of the 1979 convention. There are also inherent problems. If we are to professionally address the interests of our total membership we need to carefully consider the emphasis the marching band and related clinics will play in 1980. We would probably be wise in establishing guidelines of emphasis that more nearly balance the interests of grade, junior high and senior high teachers. The grade school-junior high members need "headliners" as well.

I am convinced that we need more interaction with personalities and producers in other parts of the country not only for their particular expertise but, of equal importance, to let the rest of the nation know that there are some very important programs and activities going on in Florida that need to be shared with those beyond the Georgia border!

This convention has the potential to be an outstanding professional experience for everyone attending. We just have to find the balanced format of activities that make it such an important event that every band director in the state would sense a professional bankruptcy if absent!

We have had some remarkably perceptive leadership at the helm of FBA each of the years I've been privileged to be a part of this convention. I have every confidence that it will continue to respond with encompassing character in the years ahead.
