


Use the interactive to model how to create a word rhythm pattern. Then decide how to play it - clap/pat/stomp or with instruments? Try it! Try it another way!

Manipulatives for children are printables to do the same activity!


200+ reading songs in Musicplay have these interactives and printables. Musicplayonline has interactive activities to model, and printables to use as manipulatives and assessments.

The interactive beat chart is a fun audiation game! Children develop inner hearing as they sing part of the song out loud, and part of the song "in their heads." The printable beat assessment - which beat does a word fall on?


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Form a circle. Pass a beach ball to the beat. If you have the beach ball on the word "you," you're out and sit down. You can also use "Icka Backa" to select racers. Pound fists, or tap shoulders of one student per beat. The student selected on the word "you" is racer one; the student opposite will also race. They speed walk around the circle, back to their own place. The first one to reach their place wins. They should then sit down so you know they've had turns.


Plainsies Clapsies, ball bouncing game (with beanbags)

Focus on concepts: – accent, ostinato, la so mi,

Plainsies - toss beanbag, **clapsies** - toss beanbag and clap hands, **Twirl around to backsies**. - toss beanbag, roll arms, and touch hands to back **Right hand**, left hand, - toss beanbag with right hand, then left **Toss it high, toss it low**. -- toss beanbag high, then do a low toss **Touch your knee, touch your toe** - toss beanbag touch knee, - toss beanbag touch toe

Touch your heel - toss beanbag and touch heel **and through you go** - - lift your right leg and toss beanbag under your knee and catch



Reading Songs on Musicplayonline for Plainsies (and for ALL reading songs!)

Solfa or Note Name Challenge (interactive) - name the solfa notes or name the pitch letter names

Tone Ladder (interactive) - show and sing the pitched do-re-mi-fa-so-la-ti-do, Isolate and practice so-la-mi

Beat and Rhythm: 1. Point to the beat - teach that beat is the steady pulse of the music

2. Interactive Beat Chart (develop inner hearing by "hiding" some beats in your head.

- 3. Clap the Rhythm teach that rhythm is the way the words go
- 4. Beat/Rhythm Switch activity to help students differentiate between beat and rhythm
- 5. Beat or Rhythm assess if students can differentiate

6. Is it One Sound or Two - teach/label that one sound is ta, two sounds on a beat are ti-ti

7. Create a rhythm pattern - create new pattern, use as intro/ending or ostinato or as B C D sections in rondo

8. Rhythm Sort - assess 9. Rhythm Erase - assess, great ear training.

Tap and Grab Game - play with any song

- students choose a partner - start by tapping the beat: heart-tap, heart-tap. One of you will start by tapping on your heart, and the other will start by tapping on the bean bag. Practice this first.

When you can do this successfully, you can try playing the game.


- If player 1 picks up the beanbag, player 2 has to put a fist down on the object.
- If player 2 puts a flat hand down, he loses.
- Either player can pick up any time.

You do the game with any song you're working on. In Musicplayonline it's done with the song "Wallflowers"

Toss and Catch



- form long ways sets, with participants about 10' apart facing a partner. Teach the game with 1 beanbag/pair.
- when students are proficient at the game, give each player a beanbag!

Stella Ella



Directions: The Game children are seated crosslegged on the floor in a circle. Each child extends their hands, palms facing up. Each player puts the right hand over the hand of the person on the right and the left hand under the hand of the person on the left. The clapping moves clockwise around the cir-

cle. The player who begins, claps the right hand of the person on his left with her right hand. On the last word of the song, "five," the player who is about to be hit must pull his hand away before being clapped. If he pulls away in time, the clapper is "out." If he gets clapped, he is out. With Covid precautions: use sticks instead of clapping hands

Charlie the Little Monkey

Charlie the little monkey swinging from the trees. What color butterfly did he see? Start the game the same way as Stella Ella. At the end, spell and clap out the color word. Last one is out! What kind of instrument did he see? What composer did he see?

Waddally Acha

This is a camp song. Play a passing game using CDE GA Boomwhackers[®] or rhythm sticks. Use the following patterns or create your own.

Waddally acha, waddally acha tap floor, tap floor, hit hand, rest doodleeedoo, doodleeedoo, *tap left knee, hit hand, tap right knee, hit hand (2x)* Waddally acha, waddally acha tap floor, tap floor, hit hand, rest doodleeedoo, doodleeedoo. tap left knee, hit hand, tap right knee, hit hand (2x)simplest thing, there's nothing much to it. pass to the person on your right, take the tube on your left.
